We have experienced two tragedies recently that have placed

a spotlight on some safety concerns for the western portion of Griffin Road. On May 24th, a car went into the canal and a male resident of Southwest Ranches lost his life. On June 30th another car went into the canal and a resident and her dog also lost their lives. In a little over a month's time, two of our neighbors and Town family members tragically died. While we mourn those family's losses, it leaves us with questions about this section of Griffin Road.

How can we make it safer for our residents or any driver who uses this road to get to their planned destination? It is important to note that Griffin Road is owned by the State, and this section is maintained by Broward County. At our July 9th Town Council meeting, the members of the Town Council and myself heard the impassioned pleas of the widower and his daughter about concerns regarding this section of Griffin Road. Many others in attendance echoed the grieving family's sentiments. As a result of these tragedies, as well as other resident concerns, the following initiatives are being formulated.


• Council plans on passing a Town resolution that will advise the County and the Florida Department of Transportation that we believe a serious issue exists, and that action be taken to improve the safety of those using this section of road.

- Partner with the County and the South Florida Water Management District, to facilitate the installation of guardrails or any other recommended safety improvements.
- Investigate the feasibility of installing Town endorsed street sign lights, so that streets can be identified at night without visibility problems.
- Add to the number of speed limit signs already in place.

With these efforts and the already committed support of the Town Council, it is our hope that these initiatives, if brought to fruition, will minimize the risk for those traversing this portion of Griffin Road. We never want to have a tragedy like this to ever occur again.

As always, it is an honor and pleasure to serve you!

Council Member Steve Breitkreuz

There are a number of improvements that we are

working on for the western part of Griffin Road. I appreciate the efforts of those living out west in expressing their concerns about Griffin Road to me and the rest of the Council.

One of the changes that is being worked on is to work with our neighboring towns to partner with the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to obtain funding through a federal Tiger Grant for the addition of bike paths out west. If you have seen bicycle riders on this stretch of Griffin Road you know it is currently dangerous and that the extension of the bike path out west is important.

The second update that we are hoping to achieve, although it may take more time, is to have a guard rail put in place between Griffin Road and the CII canal that runs along side of the canal. The two recent tragedies out on Griffin Road have reinforced how important this is. So, we are working with the County, as this section of the road is ultimately their responsibility, to see how we can escalate the project to have guard rails in place.

Finally we are also working to see what can be done to have street corner lights put in place similar to what is on the eastern side of town on Griffin between Volunteer and Flamingo.

There has also been a discussion regarding the widening of Griffin Road west of 188th. In my



conversations with residents. I find that most are of the preference that this expansion is still not warranted. Also the traffic numbers seem to back that up. According to a 2014 traffic study done by the County, Griffin Road west of Bonaventure to the 203rd block is operating at about 22.3% of capacity and west of that to US 27 is operating at 36% of capacity. The day will come when widening this road is warranted but until then I believe that widening the road will only increase overall traffic in the area. The most important item right now is to get elements in place to make the road safer.

I appreciate the feedback of all those living out west on each of these issues, whether that feedback comes from individual residents or from Country Estates HOA. That feedback is critical in understanding the needs that we have out on western Griffin Road.

DAVIE POLICE DEPARTMENT

CIVILIAN POLICE ACADEMY

Have you ever wondered what it was like to be a police officer? Come learn all about the Davie Police Department at our upcoming 43rd Civilian Police Academy (CPA) beginning September 15, 2015. The academy is open to anyone who lives or works in the town of Davie or Southwest Ranches

"The Civilian Police Academy gives participants a good understanding of all aspects of the police department, said Sergeant Ed Smith. "The program allows you to interact with our officers and staff and gives insight into what it is like to be a police officer and how

the police department is managed."

The course includes both

classroom and field instructions. Attendees learn about the various responsibilities that face officers. as well as the procedures and techniques used by officers when handling different situations. Some of the topics include: use of force, legal issues, community policing, crime prevention, firearms familiarization, DUI enforcement, patrol and criminal investigations, community policing, media and public relations, and more.

During the course, participants visit a crime lab and gun range. They role play different scenarios that police officers often encounter to see how they might react in a similar situation. They meet with a detective that explains a homicide case in its entirety. from the time someone was called to the scene to the present. The detective reviews all of the facts of the investigation and even shares crime scene photos. The CPA also incorporates scenario-based demonstrations from the Canine Unit, Dive Team, Motor Unit, and others.

The class is held on Tuesday nights, for 10 consecutive weeks, from 7-10pm, in the Community Room at the Davie Police Department, located at 1230 South Nob Hill Road. It is limited to no more than 25 people and fills up quickly. The cost is \$25.

AROUND THE TOWN



"Well, I'm ready, and I want to design a Butterfly -Friendly Garden."

If you are excited about all the great news concerning the Town's initiative to become a Community Habitat, and wish to help by certifying your own yard, butterfly gardening is a fun, and inexpensive way to begin.

Butterflies require two types of plants: host plants and nectar plants. This month's article will center on host plants-the plants upon which the larva, or caterpillar, will feed. The host plant attracts butterflies, which in turn lay eggs upon the plant. The eggs hatch within a few days into tiny caterpillars. After several molts (instars), and a final pupal stage, the caterpillars emerge as butterflies.

Host plants generally attract specific butterfly species:

- Milkweed = Monarch
- Passion Vine = Gulf Fritillary
- Fennel/Parsley/Dill = Black Swallowtail
- Cloudless Sulfur = Cassia

Our town is fortunate to have many local nurseries. Contact them and explain your goal. We are sure they will try to help. To assist in your search, here is a list of host plants suitable to the South Florida climate:

The Davie Fire Rescue Department in partnership with the Town of Southwest Ranches will be offering free training for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). CERT is about readiness, people helping people, rescuer safety, and doing the greatest good for the greatest number. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens will be initially on their own and their actions can make a difference. Through training and exercises you will learn how to put out small fires, manage utilities,

you will learn now to put out small tires, manage utilities, provide basic first aid, how to conduct search and rescue and how to properly remove victims from an area.

Anyone who lives or works in the "Town of Southwest Ranches or Davie" and is over 18 years old is eligible for the training classes that are scheduled to begin on Tuesday, September 15, 2015 from 6 to 8:30 pm and continue for eight weeks. The class will meet at the Davie Fire Administration building located at 6901 Orange Drive. You must register by August 31, 2015 to participate.
