

Speed Kills! Now that I have your attention I wanted to discuss one of

the most frequent complaints members of the Town Council and myself receive from our residents - speeding. According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration data nearly a third of traffic fatalities are caused by speeding. Davie Police, at our direction and the request of many residents, have begun increased enforcement efforts in an attempt to prevent a tragedy before it occurs. Traffic enforcement isn't the only answer. The Town is considering other traffic calming measures, such as speed strips, enhanced signage and lane striping, while still other options are being considered. On February 11th a community meeting was held with residents along Stirling Road to discuss options for effective traffic calming measures. The Town's efforts are only part of the equation. We also need you to be mindful of your speed as you travel on Town roads. Please pay attention to, and obey, the posted speed limit - the life you save may be your own.

On a lighter note, the third annual Chili Cook Off benefitting the Aster Knight Parks Foundation was held at the Sunshine Ranches Equestrian Park on February 28th. A good time was had by all who attended. If you didn't get to attend we hope that you can join us next year. Congratulations to the winners.

By the time you get this newsletter half of the second month of the year

will be history. Time sure passes quickly but we are fortunate to have been here to enjoy it and I hope your health has been good. This has been a slow month because of the holidays and there was only one Council meeting in January. During that meeting we Passed a Resolution giving the Mayor, Town Administrator and Town Attorney the okay to go ahead with the installations of the guardrails along Stirling Road this is something in my opinion that for a safety reason needed to be done. We were

fortunate the Town was appropriated \$478,000 from the State Legislature for the installation of the guard rails. The entire project is estimated to cost \$612,993. The work must be completed before December 31, 2016. Funds are available in the Fiscal Year 2015 Municipal Transportation Fund account. We passed a resolution approving an agreement with the State of Florida Department of Transportation for \$243,000 to extend SW 190th Avenue from 49th Street to Griffin Road. We also approved to raise the salary of the Town Administrator and the Town Financial Administrator.



Brief legislation from the January 22, 2015 Town Council meeting:

- Adopted Resolution 2015-018 approving an agreement with FDOT to extend 190th Avenue.
- Adopted Resolution 2015-019 approving an agreement with FDOT to complete guardrail improvements along Stirling Road.
- Adopted Resolution 2015-020 approving an agreement with Broward County for 3 Town entranceway signs.
- Adopted Resolution 2015-021 approving the second modification to the agreement with Town Administrator Berns.
- Adopted Resolution 2015-022 approving the second modification to the agreement with Town Financial Administrator Sherwood.
- Adopted Resolution 2015-023 approving the first modification to the agreement with Assistant Town Administrator/Town Clerk Muñiz.

If you can provide any markings on the pole it would be helpful, but not necessary. Town staff will then work with the utility responsible for the pole to have it safely removed before it becomes a hazard.

Manfred "Manny Hagen

The Town lost an extraordinary resident this past month, and Rolling Oaks lost a friend, a leader, and a neighbor. Manfred "Manny" Hagen succumbed to his battle with lymphoma. It was a battle he fought with courage. determination, and a positive attitude, right up until the very end. We in Rolling Oaks were so certain that Manny would beat this disease and pull through, we re-elected Manny to the Board of Directors of ROCA (Rolling Oaks Civic Association) in November He will be greatly missed.

Manny and his wife Marion moved to Southwest Ranches from Miami Beach twenty plus years ago. He joined ROCA and became active in the neighborhood. Manny, was unmistakable with his full mane of silver hair. Throughout the years, he served the neighborhood in whatever capacity he was needed; from President of the Civic Association to portraying

Professor Dumbledore when we did the Harry Potter theme at the haunted barn, to clean up coordinator for Rolling Oaks. When the call went out to fight for incorporation of our Town, Manny was right there. Manny firmly believed our area needed protection from outside pressures of development. He backed up those beliefs by serving on numerous neighborhood committees. Town advisory boards, and was

a constant presence at our Town Meetings.

Mango season was a special time in my neighborhood, because Manny would be like a kid in a candy store. He would leave mangos on my door step each year and they all had numbers on them. Each of his numerous trees was a different variety and he wanted to know which was the best. More than once, Manny sustained injuries, (usually from falling off a ladder) caring for and nurturing his mangos.

Manny was a man in motion: he cycled around town, often wearing his bright orange shirt, while unruly silver locks escaped the confines of his helmet. I often saw him taking his beloved Giant Schnauzers for walks in Rolling Oaks. As he walked, he would pick up trash or deliver The Rolling Oaks Times. Not only did he grow mangos he baked mango bread. You could always count

on Manny to bring his delicious homemade brownies, mango bread, or Amaretto cheesecake, to an event. Manny gave of his time and talents whenever needed.

Manny was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, but still found time to give to the community and the Town he loved. Manny knew the importance of protecting what we had for future generations. He firmly believed in protecting the rural lifestyle we cherish. His mantra was "One Way In And One Way Out" he believed in it and repeated it so often, most people do not realize where the expression originated. He knew that when you limit access to an area, you have a safer neighborhood that was one of the things he was passionate about. When we became a Town in 2000, it was because of residents like him. Manny was one of the many who made his voice and vote heard, when it was needed.

Residents such as Manny are rare, and we are grateful to have known him. He exemplified what a Southwest Rancher is, and how they shape our local history to be the best little Town to live in. Manny, I am going to miss you, but rest in peace, knowing we will do our best to keep what you and others helped create.











