Protect yourself from all infectious diseases by using these precautions.



Stay home when you are sick



Avoid contact with people who are sick



Get adequate sleep and eat well-balanced meals



Wash hands often with soap and water -20 seconds or longer

Clean all "high-touch" surfaces every day.

Labels contain instructions for safe and effective use of the cleaning product including precautions you should take when applying the product, such as wearing gloves and making sure you have good ventilation during use of the product.

The Town has been diligently following the latest developments concerning COVID-19 (Coronavirus). With so many of us in Southwest Ranches on potable water wells, it is imperative that we test our water for carcinogens and other contaminants to prevent consuming drinking water that is unsafe. While we rely on our fellow neighbors and commercial operators to be responsible about what they allow to leach into the ground, we can't be certain what

may be in our water supply unless we test. I urge you all to test your drinking water at least once a year with a responsible water testing company.

Here in Southwest Ranches, we

are all concerned about the spread of the COVID-19 virus and its impact on our community, our families, and our loved ones. We are taking steps to respond as appropriate. The administration is monitoring information sources and assessing impact as the situation develops. At the time of writing this column, the Town's birthday party and parade on April 4th has been postponed until further notice. There will be updates on the Town's website www.southwestranches.org, through the HOAs, and via message boards on Griffin Rd.

At the moment there are no confirmed cases of the coronavirus in Southwest Ranches. Obviously, that's subject to change, but you need to know where we are, as of now. While the complete clinical picture of the coronavirus is not fully understood, the main symptoms are fever, cough, and shortness of breath. Most of the illnesses so far have been mild and have not required hospitalization. Those most at risk are older persons and people with chronic medical conditions. At this point our shared priority is prevention. Each of us can play a role in preventing the spread of germs.

According to the CDC, everyone should be following standard recommendations to prevent infection spread including:

 Wash your hands regularly with soap and water for at least 20 seconds; use hand sanitizers at home and in the workplace

- If you are sick, stay home, and follow the advice of your health care provider
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow, or into a tissue, not your hands
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- · Avoid close contact with anyone showing respiratory symptoms (breathing difficulties, cough, runny nose)
- · Over-the-counter masks are generally not an effective deterrent and are not recommended for the public at this time
- Evaluate your travel plans as conditions warrant; you should rethink traveling to areas that are already under a travel advisory or areas that are experiencing an outbreak of Coronavirus
- Just like the flu, certain groups may be at higher risk, including the elderly. The risk increases for people sixty and older with the risk escalating as age increases. Particularly vulnerable are people with respiratory and underlying health issues.
- · Individuals who believe they are experiencing any of the symptoms should contact their health care professional and follow their advice. Do not go to the ER. Walking into the ER or a hospital risks exposing many uninfected patients and medical providers.

I appreciate all the recommendations and offers of help that we've gotten. Southwest Ranches is a town where we all pull together, we all work together, and we all care for each other. It's just who we are—and we should all be proud of that.




Your Southwest Ranches Tree Canopy BALD CYPRESS (Taxodium distichum)



Cypress forests once covered great areas of the Florida landscape and have played a vital role both environmentally and ecologically. Cypress wood is insect and rot resistant. The trees naturally sequester huge quantities of carbon dioxide, filter excess phosphorous and nitrogen from water, control flooding, and provide food, shelter, and habitat to a wide array of bird and mammal species. Although coniferous, cypress are deciduous, dropping their leaves in the fall. Cypress is slow-growing and long-lived. The knobs, or "knees," which emerge surrounding the root system surrounding the trunk, are thought to provide support, aeration, and storage of nutrients.

Cypress trees tend to grow in forested wetlands, along streams and rivers, in spring runs and ponds, and in places with still or slow-moving water. Cypresses are the most flood-tolerant of all Florida's trees, which is why they dominate swamps that have long flood periods.

TALKIN' TRASH

BULK... Each home should have ONE bulk pile and should be in front of their residence.

ONE PILE PLEASE...Co-piling bulk debris with your neighbor is NOT ALLOWED unless pre-approved by the Town. Co-piling will only be allowed if a resident has no other option on where to pile their debris on there property.

REMEMBER... each bulk debris pile should not exceed 12 cubic yards. Piles over 12 cubic yards are subject to a charge of \$17.50 per cubic yard and will be billed by Waste Pro for the overage.






