

Dear Residents,

What's the Census?

In 2020, the U.S. Census will define who we are as a nation and as a Town. The Census is how the U.S. government counts the number of people that live in the United States. It happens every 10 years, and the next one will take place on April 1, 2020. Because we are a young Town, this will only be the Town's second Census ever!

Why does the Census matter?

An accurate Census count is vital to our community and residents' wellbeing. Census information is important for a lot of reasons:

- It's about **FAIR REPRESENTA- TION:** After the Census is taken, the population count is used to redraw the boundaries of congressional and state legislative districts including the House of Representatives for each state. In fact, Florida gained two seats from the reapportionment after the 2010 Census. The state population increased by 2.8 million residents, or 17.6 percent.
- It's about **FUNDING:** Census data is used to distribute billions of dollars in funding to state and local governments—including funding for schools, roads, and local services that help keep our communities strong.
- It's about the **FUTURE:** Population data is used to plan where to build new schools, hospitals, and other local businesses.
- Ultimately the Census matters because **we ALL count**.

Who is counted?

The Census counts EVERYONE living in the United States – no matter their immigration status.

What questions get asked?

The 2020 Census questionnaire asks only a few simple questions of each person - name, relationship, gender, age and date of birth, race, and whether the respondent owns or rents his or her home. This simple, short questionnaire takes just a few minutes to complete.

Is the information given on the Census form kept private? YES! The information your family shares with the Census is sensitive, and the Census Bureau is legally required to protect it. The Census Bureau does not release or share information that identifies individual respondents or their household for 72 years.

- The information you share can only be used to create statistics.
- Answers cannot be shared with or used by law enforcement or any branch of the government! Not the police, ICE, FBI, CIA—no one.

Important Dates

March 12 - 20: Households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail.

April 1: Census Day is observed nationwide. By this date, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail. When you respond to the Census, you'll tell the Census Bureau where you live as of April I, 2020.

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FILING DATES ANNOUNCED FOR TOWN OF SOUTHWEST RANCHES, SOUTHWEST RANCHES

Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced 2020 calendar events for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at **Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330**

February 24th, 2020 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card, AND
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2020 may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2020, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2020, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2019 not exceeding \$30,721. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2019 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2019 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).

YOUR SOUTHWEST RANCHES TREE CANOPY GUMBO LIMBO (Busera Simaruba)



Gumbo limbos are unique natives, owing their nickname of "tourist tree" to their peeling, reddish-brown bark. These trees are popular in hot climates as specimen trees along sidewalks and within yards. If you want a fast-growing tree, gumbo limbo is a great choice: in 18 months, a seed can grow to the height of six to eight feet! Specimens are also known for drought tolerance as well as hurricane survival: while they may lose branches, the trees readily grow back following storm damage. The gumbo limbo is a wonderful wildlife plant, providing both nectar to a variety of insect species, and delectable fruit to many species of birds and mammals.

The 2020 Census and Confidentiality

Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure, and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics—they cannot be used against you in any way. By law, all responses to U.S. Census Bureau household and business surveys are kept completely confidential.

Respond to the 2020 Census to shape the future.

Responding to the census helps communities get the funding they need and helps businesses make data-driven decisions that grow the economy. Census data impact our daily lives, informing important decisions about funding for services and infrastructure in your community, including health care, senior centers, jobs, political representation, roads, schools, and businesses. More than \$675 billion in federal funding flows back to states and local communities each year based on census data.











Your census responses are safe and secure.

The Census Bureau is required by law to protect any personal information we collect and keep it strictly confidential. The Census Bureau can only use your answers to produce statistics. In fact, every Census Bureau employee takes an oath to protect your personal information for life. Your answers cannot be used for law enforcement purposes or to determine your personal eligibility for government benefits.

By law, your responses cannot be used against you.

By law, your census responses cannot be used against you by any government agency or court in any way—not by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), not by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), not by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), and not by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). The law requires the Census Bureau to keep your information confidential and use your responses only to produce statistics.



The law is clear—no personal information can be shared.

Under Title 13 of the U.S. Code, the Census Bureau cannot release any identifiable information about individuals, households, or businesses even to law enforcement agencies.

The law states that the information collected may only be used for statistical purposes and no other purpose.

To support historical research, Title 44 of the U.S. Code allows the National Archives and Records Administration to release census records only after 72 years.

All Census Bureau staff take a lifetime oath to protect your personal information, and any violation comes with a penalty of up to \$250,000 and/or up to 5 years in prison.

Accepted Recycling Collection Guidelines

All recycled materials go into the blue recycle cart. Recycling is collected once a week according to your area.

- **Paper:** Newspapers, inserts, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, office paper, soft-covered books, file folders, soda cartons, and crushed boxes including tissue boxes and those from food items such as cereal, rice and pasta.
- Flattened cardboard from non-food items such as shipping boxes. **Plastic:** containers with neck narrower than body such as soda bottles, milk, water, detergent and shampoo bottles.
- Milk and juice cartons and drink boxes.
- · Glass
- Metal: Aluminum, steel or tin food containers.

Non-Accepted Recycling Collection Guidelines

Plastic bags, pizza boxes, rechargeable batteries, styrofoam, plastic take-out containers or trays, light bulbs, mirrors, paint, pesticides, electronic accessories, medical waste, pharmaceuticals, household garbage, hoses, wires and holiday lights.




STAY IN TOUCH WITH ENGINEERING


