

If you are interested in being appointed to the vacant District 3 Council seat, you must be a resident for two years and reside in District 3. If you are unsure of your District, refer to the District map in the Council section of the town website. There is an application to complete by November 4th at 12 noon. For more information, please contact Town Hall.

We have an issue in our Town concerning canal banks and bulk pickup that may require some education for our neighbors. If your property borders a road, whether it's a federal highway like US27, a state or country road such as Griffin Rd, or a Town road, as are most within the interior of our town, there is a right-of-way abutting the road. Most residents cut the grass, maintain the swales and keep them looking nice. What most don't realize is, by law, maintenance of the right-of-way

is the responsibility of the property owner.

There are several cases around Town where residents place their bulk along the canal banks. The canal banks have been gouged by the bulk trucks over the years and some canal banks are beginning to collapse. The canal banks are in the rights-of-ways and therefore the responsibility of the adjoining property to keep maintained. The Town has been working with residents to resolve these issues. If the canal bank where you place your bulk gets gouged by the bulk pickup truck, take some pictures of the scene and file a complaint with Waste Pro, they will come out and repair the damage. You can either call them at 954-967-4200 or report it on the Town website. On our homepage click on the Waste Pro logo where it says contact-us on the lower-left side and a page will pop up to file a report. Other than damage reports, I would encourage you to use this link to report missed pickups, inadequate quality of service or any trash related concerns. WastePro responds quickly to any complaints and resolves promptly.

If the bulk truck damages the canal bank or anything in the right-of-way, and there is no report filed, the abutting property owner may be held liable for the damages. If you see any other parties damaging the canal banks (FPL, Comcast, building contractors, landscape maintenance companies), contact the Davie Police.

PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn

drawing, in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a predrafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.

2020 CENSUS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The 2020 Census is closer than you think! Here's a quick refresher of what it is and why it's essential that everyone is counted.

Everyone counts.

The census counts every person living in the U.S. once, only once, and in the right place.





It's in the constitution.

The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years. The first census was in 1790.

It's about fair representation.

Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of

House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.



lt's about \$675 billion.



The distribution of more than \$675 billion in federal funds, grants and support to states, counties and communities are based on census data.

That money is spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.



It's about redistricting.

After each decade's census, state officials redraw the boundaries of the congressional and state legislative districts in their states to account for population shifts.

Businesses use census data to decide where to build factories,





Your Butterfly Garden: JATROPHA TREE Jatropha integerrima

Jatropha is one of South Florida's best butterfly and hummingbird attracting plants, blooming an unbelievable 365 days a year! This tree grows quickly, and will reach heights of only six to eight feet. It likes full sun and a well-drained area in which to flourish. Jatropha prunes easily, and is extremely useful as an accent tree, single-yard specimen, fence liner, backdrop, or color enhancer to a bland area or wall. If you do plant multiples, give them four to six feet in spacing as their crowns reach-out from three to four feet in width. The clusters of one-inch wide, red flowers attract butterfly species such as zebra longwings, swallowtails, and monarchs.



PROPER OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A SEPTIC TANK SYSTEM

The proper operation and maintenance of septic tank systems is critical to minimizing the impact on our health and water resources. Our sole source of drinking water, the Biscayne Aquifer, is just a few feet beneath the surface of the land. All that separates us from this underground water supply is a thin layer of sand. Consequently, our water supply is extremely vulnerable to contamination.

A major advantage of the septic tank is that it has no moving parts and needs very little routine maintenance. If properly operated and maintained the system should work for 10 to 20 years. But there are problems that may show up in the house plumbing, the septic tank, distribution pipes, and the soil absorption drainfield over time or if the system is improperly operated or maintained.

Signs to look for include:

- 1. Low spots in the area above or near the drainfield.
- 2. Obnoxious odors ranging from a musty odor to a rotten egg odor to raw sewage odor.
- 3. The grass is much greener and lush above or near the drainfield.
- 4. Soggy grass in the area above or near the drainfield during dry periods.
- 5. Gurgling sounds in the plumbing.
- 6. Sluggish flow when flushing the toilet.
- 7. Backup of sewage in house plumbing.

Over time all drainfields will fail because the capacity of the soil to absorb effluent has been exceeded. The soil becomes clogged and the effluent will rise to the surface of the ground. However, premature failure most often results from failure of the homeowner to periodically pump out the sludge from the tank.

If you need an inspection or repairs to an existing septic tank system, a state registered septic tank contractor or a state certified plumber should be called. The Broward County Public Health Unit maintains lists of State registered contractors and requires permits for all repairs and installations.

Septic system owners must ensure that their systems are maintained properly. Even a well-designed and properly operating septic tank system will eventually fail if it is not also maintained. Regular maintenance can prevent failures such as clogging of the soil absorption drainfield and sewage backup into the home.



PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FILING DATES ANNOUNCED FOR TOWN OF SOUTHWEST RANCHES. **SOUTHWEST RANCHES**

Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced special 2019 homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330

November 21st, 2019 10:30 AM – 12:30 PM

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card. AND
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2019 may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2019, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2019, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2018 not exceeding \$30,174. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2018 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2018 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).
