On Wednesday July 12<sup>th</sup> Andy and I attended a virtual meeting of the SWWG Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). Discussed during this meeting were the following items:

- 1. Brief Overview of County's Procurement Process
- 2. Solid Waste & Recycling Master Plan Scope of Work (est. \$ 1M)
  - a. Seeking a qualified Consultant
  - b. Draft scope was delivered in December 2022 but our first time seeing this item was yesterday.
    - While Scope addresses compliance with regulatory requirements concerning emissions, it does not appear to contemplate vigorous independent monitoring, nor does it specifically mention Zero Waste initiatives.
    - ii. Scope also specifically mentions expanding the current WTE or the possibility of building a new one at the same location or other "reasonable" alternatives.
  - c. Utilization of an Evaluation Committee that will be appointed by the County
    - i. Criteria
      - 1. Ability, Approach, Past Performance, Workload, Location, etc.
  - d. Timeline is expected to take 6 to 12 months after award. Award may not happen for several months.
  - e. Estimated Facility Construction Costs
    - i. New WTE 5 Years \$1.1B
    - ii. Expansion of Current WTE 4 Years \$250M
    - iii. Single Stream Recycling Facility 4 Years \$70M
    - iv. Trash Transfer Station 3 Years \$30M
    - v. Bulk Waste/Yard Trash/C&D Facility 3 Years \$50M
    - vi. Yard Trash Facility 3 Years \$10M
- 3. TAC is composed of members appointed by each of the municipalities, but citizen input (public comments) is welcome but very limited.
  - a. New version of TAC will require Town Council appointee (staff level)
  - b. Two concerned citizens voiced environmental concerns including the need for Zero Waste solutions.
  - c. One industry professional representing the Composting Council expressed a desire that their interests be represented in the final Master Plan.
