RESOLUTION NO. 2001-21

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHWEST RANCHES, FLORIDA IN OPPOSITION TO PLANS TO WIDEN DYKES ROAD FROM TWO TO FOUR LANES AND TO REQUEST THAT FUNDS ALLOCATED FOR SAID WIDENING INSTEAD BE UTILIZED TO IMPROVE THE INTERSECTION OF DYKES ROAD AND GRIFFIN ROAD AT THE SITE OF THE AMOCO STATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Broward County has adopted a five year capital program providing funds for, among other purposes, the expansion of Dykes Road from two lanes to four lanes, from Griffin Road to Sheridan Street; and

WHEREAS, a major portion of Dykes Road is situated within the Town of Southwest Ranches; and

WHEREAS, that portion of Dykes Road contained within the Town of Southwest Ranches runs along side residential communities and schools; and

WHEREAS, the proposed expansion of Dykes Road from two to four lanes will present an eminent threat to the safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the Town and the children attending classes at Hawks Bluff Elementary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Council of the Town of Southwest Ranches, Florida.

Section 1: The above referenced recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

<u>Section 2</u>: The Town Council wishes to go on record as objecting to the expansion of Dykes Road from two to four lanes and requests the opportunity to meet with the appropriate staff of Broward County, Florida in order to be able to present support for its position and to solicit staff's recommendations of a denial of the proposed road expansion, and to recommend that funds allocated for the expansion of Dykes Road instead be utilized to improve the intersection of Dykes Road and Griffin road.

Section 3: That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

The Town Administrator is empowered to take all steps necessary Section 3: and proper to convey the position of the Town Council as expressed in this Resolution to the Governor and Cabinet of the State of Florida, the Florida Legislature, the Florida Department of Transportation and such other parties deemed necessary and appropriate.

The Town Administrator shall keep the Town Council informed as Section 4: to the proposed action of the Department of Transportation and shall, from time to time, recommend further action which the Town Council can take to preserve and protect the character of Southwest Ranches and the interests of its citizens.

That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its Section 5: adoption.

Dear Mr. Brossard,

We have reviewed the County 5-years capital improvement program for projects that may have an impact on the new Town of Southwest Ranches. We want to commend the County in its efforts to put in place roadway improvements on Sheridan Street and Griffin Road. These roads, as you know, are on the north (Griffin Road) and south (Sheridan Street) boarders of our Town and will provide needed road capacity improvements.

The Town does, however, have an issue with a roadway improvement that goes through our rural community. The roadway improvement is Dykes Road. We have had two workshop discussions and two agenda item discussions on the Dykes Road project. The results of our meetings are:

-The Town does not want Dykes Road changed from a two lane to a four lane roadway going from Griffin to Sheridan.

The Town would request the opportunity to meet with the staff to discuss what improvements that we can agree upon, prior to the County continuing any plan design on this project.

We will contact your office for a meeting with the appropriate staff members.
