Regular Meeting of the Town Council of Southwest Ranches was held 13400 Griffin Road in the Southwest Ranches Council Chambers. The meeting, having been properly noticed, was called to order by Mayor Breitkreuz at 7:00 PM. Attendance was noted by roll call and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Quasi-Judicial Hearings

3. Lake House Waiver of Plat

7. Board Reports

There were no Board Reports.

8. Council Member Comments

Council Member Jablonski spoke about upcoming events, such as the "Hazmat at the Barn" on July 10 and the DMV's Flow Mobile on August 25. He then spoke about the July 4th holiday and how the animals were affected. He spoke about having a discussion regarding drafting a local bill with Representative Bartleman and placing a question on the ballot as a voter referendum to ban fireworks within the Town. Next, he suggested giving the Town staff extra time to prepare the meeting agenda. The tight timeframe is having some backlash resulting in an uptick of amended agendas due to a late submission or an error. A discussion ensued and it was agreed that the agenda be completed and provided to the Town Council 10 days prior to a meeting. Lastly, Council Member Jablonski spoke about the waiver of plat process. The original intention was to streamline the process for Town residents who had large acreage and wanted to section off a portion for family members. However, what has been happening is people are purchasing larger properties and then applying for the waiver of plat to avoid the platting process. Council Member Jablonski proposed placing a Zoning In Progress on the waiver of plat procedure and send it to the Comprehensive Plan Advisory Board to review and decide whether the Town should go back to the original platting procedure, which takes more time and is more costly. The Zoning In Progress would not affect any applications that have already been submitted. A discussion was had and Town Attorney Poliakoff clarified the intent and the law regarding waivers of plat and advised the Town Council of their options going forward.

Vice Mayor Hartmann reminded the public of the upcoming July 13th First Responder and Front-Line Workers photo shoot at the Rolling Oaks Barn. He next asked Town Administrator Berns if the Town could call Broward County Mosquito Control and ask to have the Town sprayed via airplane. Vice Mayor Hartmann thought it was a great idea to place a firework ban referendum on the 2022 ballot as it allows the community to decide and takes the Town Council out of the equation. Council Member Jablonski asked Town Attorney Poliakoff what the Council's next step would be, to which he advised. Mayor Breitkreuz stated he would like to choose a date and discuss all the items to go on the 2022 ballot. Town Attorney Poliakoff directed Town Clerk Muñiz to call the Supervisor of Elections and find out when the charter amendments need to be received to be placed on the ballot. The Town can then work on creating language, adopting the ordinance and have a sole purpose meeting to decide what items Town Council wants to move forward. Lastly, Vice Mayor Hartmann spoke about the amount of vandalism, car thefts and breaking into cars happening in Town. Vice Mayor Hartmann advised the residents to lock their car doors and remember to take their key fobs with them and always pay attention to their surroundings.

Council Member Allbritton thanked the residents for coming out to the meeting. He stated he agrees with Council Member Jablonski regarding the fireworks issue; however, he did speak with the residents of Green Meadows and they told him the 4th of July is a very special day to this Country. Council Member Allbritton can see not allowing fireworks for Christmas and New Year's Eve, but the 4th of July means something special to people. He asked if the referendum is drafted to please make it so the majority of the Town can live with it. Council Member Allbritton provided traffic citation results which have decreased. He felt the crackdown on speeding is working. Lastly, Council Member Allbritton addressed the many code violations that are issued for non-permitted fill. He advised the Drainage and Infrastructure Advisory Board are working on fill issues, but he wanted to make sure residents know to come in and fill out an application for a level one permit if they only have one or two loads of fill.

Council Member Kuczenski thanked the residents for coming to the meeting. He spoke about an incident that happened on July 3rd regarding loose horses in Sunshine Ranches. He immediately called Volunteer Fire Rescue Chief Bennett who advised he would send out the volunteer firefighters. Council Member Kuczenski stated the Fire Chief was very receptive and he was very proud of the firefighters for immediately responding. Davie Police were at the scene by the time Council Member Kuczenski arrived. He wanted to thank Davie Police, Chief Bennett and the firefighters for their responsiveness. Council Member Kuczenski received an image and it was a photo of a Davie Police Officer pulling over a driver going 106 miles per hour. He was astounded. He spoke about a stolen Rolls Royce in Sunshine Ranches. Council Member Kuczenski indicated his support of the fireworks ban referendum. Council Member Kuczenski received a call regarding illegal dumping on Hancock Road. The Davie Police were called, and they contacted the individuals performing the dumping. Next, Council Member Kuczenski agreed with placing a Zoning In Progress on the waiver of plat application process until the Comprehensive Plan Advisory Board reviews and advises the Town Council of their recommendations. Lastly, Council Member Kuczenski spoke about the intersection changes on Sheridan Street, Volunteer Road and SW 146th Ave, to which the Town Council voted no. They had decided creating a left turn lane on Sheridan Street for Volunteer Road would encourage more cut through traffic. Council Member Kuczenski learned that some of the residents on the Davie side of Volunteer Road do want the left turn onto

Volunteer Road. Council Member Kuczenski made a public request from Davie for accident statistics at that location. He read them to the public at the meeting and made copies available.

Mayor Breitkreuz thanked the public for coming out on such a rainy night. He spoke on the proposed intersection changes off Sheridan Street turning left onto Volunteer Boulevard. He reached out to the Davie Town Council and asked for their support to oppose the left turn onto Volunteer Road. Mayor Breitkreuz stated he had good conversations with two members of the Davie Town Council, one of them being Council Member Marlon Luis, in whose district the intersection is located. Davie Council Member Luis advised Mayor Breitkreuz he will speak to the residents in Ivanhoe on the West side of Volunteer Road and advise them of the Town's concerns as this change would affect them as well. Regarding the fireworks ban referendum, Mayor Breitkreuz agreed the Town is on the right path to correcting the issue as well as appreciating Council Member Allbritton's comments regarding the resolution should benefit the entire Town and not just one group. Mayor Breitkreuz supported the Town contacting Broward County Mosquito Control Division regarding spraying. Mayor Breitkreuz reminded the residents his "Q&A with the Mayor" is the upcoming Wednesday, July 14th. Lastly, Mayor Breitkreuz wanted to recognize Joan Boyd, former Chair of the Rural Public Arts Board, and thank her for all her dedication to the Town.

9. Legal Comments

Town Attorney Poliakoff provided the phone number to Broward County Mosquito Control, as well an easy online request form. He clarified to the Town Council they have 6 months until the Charter Amendments must be brought forward for consideration. He advised the Town Council they need to bring forth a resolution to appoint the Charter Review Committee as soon as possible. A discussion ensued regarding the makeup of the Charter Review Committee; if the Committee would be made up of residents of the Town, the Comprehensive Plan Advisory Board or The Town Council themselves. The Town Council then asked for some public input on the matter and it was agreed by the Town Council that they would each appoint a resident of the Town to represent the Charter Review Committee. Town Attorney Poliakoff also mirrored Mayor Breitkreuz sentiments regarding Joan Boyd.

10. Administration Comments

Town Administrator Berns welcomed the Town Council back to in person meetings. He advised the Town Staff is in Town Hall and available for any questions or comments. Town Administrator Berns thanked Assistant Town Administrator Muñiz for filling in while he was on vacation.
