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

Dear Residents,

At the September 14, 2020 First Budget Hearing, the Town Council adopted the final solid waste and final fire services assessment. As your Mayor, I am pleased to inform you that there is no increase to the solid waste assessment. The fire services assessment has unfortunately increased as a result of contractually obligated increased costs in fire protection. Additionally, we are required to perform a study to justify the methodology we use to assess fire response costs. In July, we completed a new study to update the last study that was performed in 2011. While some classification categories saw an increase in their fees, some classifications saw a decrease as a result of the new methodology report. Overall, I am not pleased with the results of the fire study, and I vow to continue working on this item.

At the same meeting, the Town Council approved the tentative millage rate set at 4.2500 mills. This is a significant reduction in the millage rate from last year's millage rate of 4.6564 mills. The newly lowered rate places Southwest Ranches as the 5th lowest millage rate of the 31 municipalities in Broward County. I am proud of the Town Council and Administration for being fiscally conservative that allows us to reduce the rate to this level that is the Town's lowest in more than 6 years. It is important to note the Town only accounts for less than 25% of your total property tax bill. Broward County, the School Board, South Broward Hospital District, and other taxing agencies make up the other 75%. While we lowered our millage rate, you may still realize an overall tax increase. I urge you to review your tax bill to see where your property tax dollars go.

The Town held a Second Budget Hearing on September 24, 2020 to adopt the final millage rate and final budget. The final budget was set at just over \$13 million. Our goals for this budget cycle were to keep rates as low as possible, eliminate any additional borrowing, maintain service levels, and fund only critical projects such as fire well replacements, drainage improvement projects, and pavement striping and marking. was to be done all while operating in a constrained economic environment as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. I believe we have accomplished these goals. My hope is that more of you will be involved in the budget process going forward to help us craft future budgets with your priorities in mind.

Elections are a month away. The pandemic has

made this election unlike any other. It's doubtful that the status of COV-ID-19 will change enough between today and election day to allow the candidates to shake hands, kiss babies, or give you a hug, all standard fare for political candidates and campaigns. So, let's see how creative they get.

This year three seats are being contested in Southwest Ranches (SWR). The mayor's seat has two contestants. there are three people vying for the District 3 council seat (Green Meadows, Deems Ranches, and Ivanhoe Estates) and two residents are running for District 4 (Sunshine Ranches). Remember, in SWR, we live in districts; however, we vote to fill all seats, not just the one in the district we live in. As always there will be signs everywhere, and you will get mailings. The number of signs posted around town and quantity of mailers sent out shows that the candidate can raise money. To be an informed voter, you need to know more.





Spend a few minutes, think about our Town and what you enjoy about it and areas that it could be improved. Ask yourself, are you happy with the performance of the incumbents? Have they responded to and addressed your concerns when you have raised an issue? Do their respective visions match yours for the Town, do they engage with the you to stay abreast of the issues that concern you? Do they come to Council meetings informed and well prepared to vote on the issues? Think about the challengers. Do their positions represent the things you want to see changed or left as they are? Who is contributing to their campaigns? Do they have a solid character? Do they have a criminal past? Do they understand the issues confronting the Town? What relevant experience do they possess? Are they active in their HOA? What Town boards have they served on or reqularly attend? In all cases, if it's important to you, ask who wants to preserve our rural lifestyle and who wants commercial development in town. To answer these questions, look at who contributed to their campaign and what are their interest in our town, not necessarily what the candidate says.

To answer these questions for yourself, there are tools available to help ferret out this information. Spend some time and Google each of the candidates. See what has been written in the press about the incumbents and challengers. On the Southwest Ranches website, under the Council tab, there is an Elections section underneath. To see who is contributing to the various campaigns, click on Electronic Campaign Report Portal and check each candidate's contribution records. If you want to check voting records, on the town site go to Departments and click on Town Clerk and then Minutes. All votes are recorded by the Clerk. You can also look up Town of Southwest Ranches on YouTube and watch some

Council meeting to see how the various incumbents comport themselves during the Council meeting. Who uses fear to persuade rather than the truth and facts? Going forward, the challengers will be making comments on all legislation under consideration and also talking about their position on issues during public comment. Finally, I would encourage you to attend the Council meetings (2nd and 4th Thursday at 7 PM, monthly). They are being conducted as Zoom sessions (link on town website and Facebook page) for now and will resume at Town Hall at some point.

I hope this info help you make an informed decision. If you want things to change in Southwest Ranches, vote. If you don't want things in SWR

to change, vote.

In the meantime, I want to assure you that the Town will continue to provide uninterrupted service to you and your family. As we navigate through these challenging times, I'm reminded of how fortunate we are to be part of this strong community that supports each other to accomplish great things. It is the power of this community that will propel us through this to better times.



PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn drawing, in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a pre-drafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.


