

Council Member Freddy Fisikelli

This has been a very busy month due to the upcoming elections in November. I want to thank the President's Council for holding

the debate for the Candidates for those offices. In district #4 David Kuczensk will be running against Denise (Dee) Schroeder and in district #3 Barry Neunzig will be running against me.

The new charter school has been in operation and has not been a problem as of this date there has been a police officer stationed at the intersection on Griffin Road in the morning and the afternoon.

SW 190th Avenue this is the current information on this road. Once the current construction is completed and is inspected, the road will be blocked until we can complete our review and implementation of proper traffic flow at the southern end of 345.

Our goal is to get the construction access point open and remove 345 traffic from SW 188th Avenue, Thus providing access and relief to both neighborhoods.

On October 24th, there was a meeting with Council Member Breitkreuz the people of 345 and 188th Avenue know that effective November 1st (for 6 months) the north end 190, 54and 57 will be closed. The only access into 345 will be via 63rd Street.

The Town will meet with Traffic planner Town Hall to work for a practical solution for the south end of 345 of SW 63rd Avenue.

Your Southwest Ranches Fire Rescue's been doing a lot of company training with Davie Fire Department. There have been several hours of training dedicated to hands on hose management and apparatus operations/pumping. Furthermore, ladder safety drills, fire ground orientation, customer service in the fire service and EMS training.

The first few minutes on any complex scene, especially a motor vehicle accident collision, are critical. Emotions are high, and the environment is really extremely unforgiving. Some of our priorities we address or fail to address in the first few seconds guide the direction of the scene for the duration of the call. This is why we train often so that we are prepared when the alarm sounds.

Also, I was sent a letter from a concerned Town resident

thanking me for the articles on animals. However, I did not mention tattooing for animals which is excellent and easy way to identify your pet. Thank you for bringing this to my attention.
