





This has been a tough year with a lot going on. However, we will overcome all the obstacles and continue as normal. Your Southwest Ranches Fire Fighters strive to exceed all expectations and follow the highest industry

standards to provide the best level of service to our Southwest Ranches Residents.

Assistant Chief Bob Sahdala has resigned and moved out of Broward County after living here for 50 years. He decided to move closer to his family as he stated, he is not getting any younger. Assistant Chief Sahdala was a positive figure in our department and brought our Firefighters, Paramedics and EMT's to a higher level, training at the Broward Fire Academy more often than the majority of Departments in Broward County.

Bruce Evans is the new Chief of Training; he has been with SWRFD as a Training Officer for 9 years. Bruce is a retired Fire Officer (28.5 years) from Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue and is a Certified Fire Instructor, Live Fire Instructor, Fire Inspector, CPR Instructor and Paramedic.

Also, we have two new additions to the Fire Department. Training Officer Paul Arquari just retired from the City of Pembroke Pines Fire Rescue (28 years in the fire service) He has been a Fire Instructor at the Broward Fire Academy for 19 years. He is on the USAR Team, Task Force-2 and on the United States Incident Management Team.

The new Assistant Fire Chief Bill Updegraff, retired from BSO Fire Rescue after 34 years (May 31,2020). The last 10 years of his career he worked in the BSO Fire Marshall's Office. He was assigned to the Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport and Seaport. He is a certified E.M.T. and has handled many large contracts involving Life Safety Projects and was assigned to Broward Operations Command.
