

In May of 2015 the Town's contracted building department service supplier C.A.P. Government, Inc. (CAP) moved into office space at Town Hall. The purpose of the move was to consolidate the building department process and minimize the inconvenience to our residents and their contractors. Since that time, Town staff and our partner CAP have continued to work towards improving service delivery. While the service and the conve- Jeff nience to our residents and their contractors has improved, we continue to strive for excellent service delivery and customer satisfaction. In reviewing our building department operations with CAP recently, we identified some options that should improve service delivery even further. Another facet of our building permit application process that we will analyze is our permit fees. While some people have been critical of the Town's permit fees it is important to note that these fees reflect the Town Council's previous policy direction of cost recovery. The policy direction follows that those who are utilizing this service should pay its costs. The costs should not be subsidized by general fund tax dollars supplied by those who may not be using the service. To ensure that development fees are just and reasonable, the Town Council will be holding a workshop in the near future to analyze them. We invite you to attend and take part in this important discussion.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to recognize someone that has dedicated many years of service to the Town. In February, Juanita Romance resigned her position with the Town after almost 9 years of service. Her contributions to the Town are numerous and while she will be missed I wish her all the best in her future endeavors.

On another note, the fourth annual Chili Cook Off benefitting the Southwest Ranches Parks Foundation was held at the Sunshine Ranches Equestrian Park on March 5th. A good time was had by all who attended. If you didn't get to attend we hope that you can join us next year. Congratulations to the winners.

Council Member Steve Breitkreuz

There are times when there are events that seem to get a little more

attention then they deserve. An example of that for me is New Year's. It's fun but somehow it seems like on the first of the year the world is still very similar to the world that I knew the year before. However, other times there are very significant events that seem to get little recognition but truly are of a major significance. One of those significant events recently occurred in our town, without much fanfare.

Back when our town was formed, there was a section of property that Corrections was owned by Corporation of America (CCA) that was included as part of our town. This was done specifically because it was recognized that the make up of our town would be mostly rural residential homes. Most towns require a mixture of residential, retail, and commercial properties for the tax base to be stable and diverse for the long term. Well, Southwest Ranches clearly has the residential. There is a little bit of retail on Dykes road at Griffin and at Sheridan. Then the town founders included the CCA property so that there would be a commercial element as well.

Recently. Pembroke Pines made an offer to CCA to purchase the property. However, with Pines being the owner, it is very possible that Southwest Ranches would not be able to obtain commercial revenue from















property. Fortunately, in the original contract, Southwest Ranches had the right of first refusal should CCA decide to sell the property.

So, at our February 18 meeting, after much discussion and a tremendous amount of negotiation by our town administrator, town attorney, and town financial administrator, we were able to work out a plan to purchase the property from CCA. I was very pleased with the terms of the purchase and the related loan. With this purchase we can finally move forward with finding the proper use of the property. One that not only will the town residents will be comfortable with but also one that will finally facilitate the generation of commercial taxes which will help ensure that our taxes remain some of the lowest in Broward County.

I wish to send out special thanks for Martin Sherwood, our Financial Administrator, for all of his work in bringing this deal together. Without his constant vigilance and strong negotiation skills, this purchase would not have been possible. Thank-you Marty!





Council Member Freddy Fisikelli

I believe the most item talked around the town now the

property where the prison was to be built, for some reason the City of Pembroke Pines is interested in buying the property. Why at this time I do not know why. If they do buy the property we lose the ability to receive any money for the taxes that would be levied on that property if they keep it, because Cities do not pay taxes on property they own. Also Pines might then to try to annex the property into their City. At the present time our Financial Administrator Martin Sherwood is in the process of working out a way the Town of Southwest Ranches could purchase the property ourselves to insure we are protected and would give us the ability to sell the property to whomever we feel would benefit the Town of Southwest Ranches the most. On the 15th of March I was able to attend a hearing in West Palm Beach before the Fourth District Court of Appeals in which CCA was appealing the lower court's decision in the CCA versus Pembroke Pines case.

Mosquito-borne Zika virus

The Zika virus, a mosquito-borne virus, has been confirmed in several travelers who recently visited Latin America. At this time there is one suspected case of imported Zika virus in Broward County. The Mosquito Control Section of the Highway and Bridge Maintenance Division is working in conjunction with the Florida Health Department to monitor the suspected case of the virus. The Zika virus is carried by the same species of mosquito that we have been targeting over the years. In order to reduce the spread of the virus and other diseases, we are continuing to limit the mosquito population around Broward County by spraying areas with reported concentrations of mosquitoes, checking known mosquito breeding sites, treating standing water from recent rain events, and spraying in areas requested by residents. To request mosquito spraying, or call 954-765-4062.

The Zika virus is a flavivirus, part of the same family as yellow fever, West Nile, chikungunya and dengue. Symptoms of the virus include fever, rash, and joint pain. Zika virus is spread through the bite of the Aedes aegypti species mosquito. This species of mosquito is often found in areas with stagnant water



such as of uncovered buckets, flower pots, unused swimming pools and discarded tires. So as to curb the spread of the virus, we urge people to dump or drain any standing water that has collected in their property.

- ☑ Social Security Number for all owners FOR RESIDENT ALIENS:
- ☑ Permanent Resident "Green Card," or proof of asylum, or INS I-485 letter showing that application to convert to permanent resident status is complete.

The Senior Exemption requires at least one owner be 65 as of January 1, 2016 and the total household adjusted gross income not exceed \$28,448. (call for info on required documents)



Proper Operation and Maintenance of a Septic Tank System

The proper operation and maintenance of septic tank systems is critical to minimizing the impact on our health and water resources. Our sole source of drinking water, the Biscayne Aquifer, is just a few feet beneath the surface of the land. All that separates us from this underground water supply is a thin layer of sand. Consequently, our water supply is extremely vulnerable to contamination.

A major advantage of the septic tank is that it has no moving parts and needs very little routine maintenance. If properly operated and maintained the system should work for 10 to 20 years. But there are problems that may show up in the house plumbing, the septic tank, distribution pipes, and the soil absorption drainfield over time or if the system is improperly operated or maintained.

Signs to look for include:

- **1.** Low spots in the area above or near the drainfield.
- **2.** Obnoxious odors ranging from a musty odor to a rotten egg odor to raw sewage odor.
- **3.** The grass is much greener and lush above or near the drainfield.
- 4. Soggy grass in the area


- above or near the drainfield during dry periods.
- **5.** Gurgling sounds in the plumbing.
- **6.** Sluggish flow when flushing the toilet.
- **7.** Backup of sewage in house plumbing.

Over time all drainfields will fail because the capacity of the soil to absorb effluent has been exceeded. The soil becomes clogged and the effluent will rise to the surface of the ground. However, premature failure most often results from failure of the homeowner to periodically pump out the sludge from the tank.

If you need an inspection or repairs to an existing septic tank system, a state registered septic tank contractor or a state certified plumber should be called. The Broward County Public Health Unit maintains lists of State registered contractors and requires permits for all repairs and installations.


Septic system owners must ensure that their systems are maintained properly. Even a well-designed and properly operating septic tank system will eventually fail if it is not also maintained. Regular maintenance can prevent failures such as clogging of the soil absorption drainfield and sewage backup into the home.



PRESCRIPTOIN DRUG DROP OFF AT TOWN HALL...

SATURDAY APRIL 30_{TH} 2016 FROM 10AM TO 2PM

On Saturday, April 30, 2016 from 10:00am – 2:00pm, Officer Tara Bradley, Community Policing Unit Special Operations Division of the Davie Police Department, will be utilizing Town Hall as a drop off location for old drugs.

The Davie Police Department is partnering with *the Drug Enforcement Administration on their 11th National Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative*. It is a one-day collaborative effort with the DEA and local law enforcement to remove potentially dangerous prescription drugs from our nation's homes. This initiative will provide an opportunity for the public to voluntarily surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutically controlled substances and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction.

If any resident has any questions about possible drug drop off locations, Davie Police Department has a drop off box in the lobby of the police department (1230 S Nob Hill Rd. Davie, FL 33324). You can drop off meds any time in their lobby, Monday-Friday, 9:00am-5:00pm excluding holidays. They do not accept sharps/needles, lotions, gels, liquids or aerosols. If someone requires needles to be dropped off, you may contact Officer Tara Bradley at (954) 693-8269 and she will arrange to meet me you at the police department so that the needles may be disposed of safely (not in the drop box!). If anyone has any questions about the drug box, you may contact Officer Tara Bradley on Tuesday through Friday from 7:00am -5:00pm or email her at tara_bradley@davie-fl.gov.
