

Dear Residents,

While we enjoy our rural lifestyle, there is something that we cannot escape – traffic. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has done some things to improve traffic and some that leaves me scratching my head. I want to bring your attention to a couple of issues regarding traffic.

First, by the time that you receive this newsletter, the I-75 express lane project should be complete and open for use. For our residents who wish to use it for points going north and east you will have to enter I-75 at Sheridan Street. I want to thank the FDOT project team for their outreach efforts in communicating major milestones for this project. They provided email updates, which we posted on our website and sent out Town Talk email messages to subscribers. They also had two public meetings in surrounding communities to get the word out. Additionally, they attended our December 14, 2017 Town Council and provided a multimedia presentation of the project. If you would like to view the meeting where this was presented vou can view it on our YouTube channel.

Second, FDOT intends to "improve" the Griffin Road/I-75 interchange by installing a traffic light on the eastside of I-75 that would resemble the interchange that has been placed at Sheridan Street. I am strongly against this "improvement" as I believe it will actually cause more accidents for east bound drivers in

### **CODE ENFORCEMENT AND YOU:**

### **Issuance of Violations to Start for Over-the-Limit Bulk Piles**

The Code Enforcement Department, managed by Code Services Inc., oversees enforcing the bulk ordinance as well as any trash related issues that were passed by the Town Council. As we all know, on October 1, 2017, the Town of Southwest Ranches changed vendors for the collection of bulk as well as solid waste and recyclables. The Department has not issued warnings or civil violations since we were recuperating from the effects of Hurricane Irma. Now that the regular bulk collection has resumed, we will begin enforcement of the new regulations. Please be aware of the new procedure as outlined above and below. As always please contact us if you have any questions.

Below are changes to the enforcement process:

**Enforcement Action to Change** As required by code, property owners can place a maximum of 12 cubic yards per bulk pick up, which is the size of a Volkswagen Beetle.

Please remember that any lawn or construction debris generated by a landscaper or contractor on your property must be removed by that vendor for disposal. Residents who fail to abide by this rule are subject to a \$500 code violation.

- Code Enforcement will no longer tag or determine if the pile's size is beyond the 12 yards allowed, or if a combination of piles is beyond the 12 yards allowed. Waste Pro will make this determination. Once they do, pictures of the pile will be taken by the company, and the entire amount will be collected. However, a bill of \$17.50 per cubic yard will be sent to the property owner for the overage.
- If the property owner does not pay the bill as indicated by Waste Pro, then the Town will issue a civil violation and a case will be heard in court, no warnings will be issued for this type of violation prior to a civil violation notice.
- During the Code proceedings, a fine in the amount of \$500.00 and an administrative court cost in the amount of \$150.00 may be imposed on the property in addition to the original costs that Waste Pro may have incurred during

the pickup as outlined by their original bill to the resident.

### Enforcement Action Remains the Same

- As required by code, property owners are required to place bulk out for pick up no earlier than the Saturday prior to the collection week (as per the schedule). If you place the bulk items on the Friday prior to collection week, you will be in violation of the requirements of the code.
- Code Enforcement is required to issue a warning notice of violation for the first time, and a civil violation notice for any other occurrence as long as the property ownership remains the same. A warning notice does not carry any penalty, but a civil violation carries a penalty of \$500.00 per occurrence.

We make every effort to provide information to the residents such as articles, delivery of schedules in the form of a magnet and copies of the schedule with the warning notices in an effort to avoid the issuance of a civil penalty. As such new schedules were delivered by the Town to all residents, and information is being distributed in various forms as well.

The Town needs your help by adhering to the information above. We are here to help you understand the process and get items that were left behind by mistake. As such please contact the Town as soon as possible to resolve any issues. The Town of Southwest Ranches works with all residents to make sure that all their needs are met.





- <u>AVOID A FINE OF \$500.00</u> Bulk cannot be placed out earlier than the Saturday prior to your scheduled bulk pick up date.
- <u>AVOID A FINE OF \$500.00</u> Landscaper or Contractor generated waste on your property must be removed by that vendor for disposal.
- Bulk Piles over-the-limit of <u>12 Cubic Yards</u>
  will be picked up and the vendor will bill the
  resident the additional yardage at the rate of
  \$17.50 per the cubic yard.

# Southwest Ranches FIRE RESCUE







**Register Now for Next CERT Training Class** 

The Davie Fire Rescue Department will be offering free training for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). The next CERT training class is scheduled to begin on **February 13, 2018.** Anyone who lives or works in the Town of Davie or Southwest Ranches and is over 18 years old is eligible for the training classes. The class will meet at the Davie Fire Administration building located at 6901 Orange Drive. You must register before the class begins. Go to www.davie-fl.gov to download the CERT application.

The CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training taught in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when public safety personnel are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to take a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community. By getting trained in CERT, you will have the skills to help emergency responders save lives and protect property.
