

Dear Residents,
Our community

has been victimized by home burglaries recently. Interestingly, a majority have happened on Saturday evenings, presumably because the perpetrators believed most people would be out for the evening on a Saturday night. While Davie PD is working hard to crack these cases, we ask for your help in remaining alert. If you see something or someone out of the ordinary in your neighborhood please report it to the Davie Non-Emergency phone number (954) 693-8200. Davie will send out a unit to look into it. Better to help prevent a crime, than be the victim of one. Obviously, if you witness a crime in progress call 911 - don't try to be a hero. Additionally, please do your part to keep from becoming a victim by locking your car doors and securing your valuables every night before you go to bed. Often times thieves get access to your possessions merely because your vehicle parked in the driveway was left unlocked. What's worse is that once they get into the vehicle your garage door opener is inside, which may allow thieves access to your home while you are sleeping. The Town is considering starting a Crime Watch program to help prevent these types of crimes. If you are interested in participating, or have other useful tips to prevent these crimes, please contact me at 954-274-6508.

Another issue I want to address with you is that of CyberSecurity. There has been a noticeable increase in the number of cyberattacks on government institutions in the past few years, and the Town is not immune to this threat. While we have safeguards in place, breaches to our defenses can and have happened. Recently a Town employee's email account was compromised which then sent an email to everyone in their address book asking the recipient to click on a link which sought to collect personal information. Clicking on this link or opening the attachment could provide access to your personal information potentially leaving you vulnerable to fraud or extortion. If you ever receive an unsolicited email from Town Hall, or anyone else for that matter, asking you to click on a link or open an attachment please contact the sender first to confirm that it is a valid email. This simple practice might save you from a very stressful situation.

THE VULNERABLE POPULATION REGISTRY

WHO SHOULD REGISTER....

You should register in the Vulnerable Population Registry if you are at risk due to a disability, frailty or health issue, regardless of age, AND elect to stay at home in the event of a hurricane or other emergency. Registration information will be used for planning purposes only. Registration does not guarantee that you will be provided assistance.

If you have a special medical need, you are strongly encouraged to register for Broward County's Special Needs Shelter. Registration should be in advance before a storm threatens. To register for a Special Needs Shelter and/or transportation to the shelter, call Broward County Human Services Department at 954-357-6385 (TTY 954-357-5608). There are some

limitations, so be sure to inquire about your specific situation when you call to register.

If you are in an evacuation zone you are strongly encouraged to evacuate to a safe refuge with a family member or friend. A Red Cross General Population Shelter should be a refuge of last resort.

The Vulnerable Population Registry is a year-round, hazard program that allows people who would be at risk to register in advance of an emergency so the town may plan a better response during a recovery effort.




STAY IN TOUCH WITH ENGINEERING

However the Town recommends that a property owner or leasee contact our office to assure that the type of work being performed falls under this criteria prior to performing the work. THORGUARD ELECTRONIC LIGHTNING PREDICTION SYSTEM...

It's that time of year for hot weather, lots of rain and storms! Listen for the Thorguard Lightening Prediction System, a warning that a lightning storm is approaching.

HOW THE PREDICTION SYSTEM WORKS...

If you hear a siren go off in a Broward County Park, you should take notice. Currently there are 19 Broward County parks and nature centers that use the **Thorguard Electronic Lightning Prediction System**, consisting of a central sensor unit on a main building and one or more relay horns to provide coverage of an entire area. In addition to the air horns, a yellow strobe light continues to flash after the horns have sounded and stays on until three short horn blasts provide an all-clear signal.



In the event of a warning (one long 15-second blast), you have between eight and 15 minutes to take shelter, depending on the speed of the storm. Most fatalities occur after a storm has

passed, when people think it is safe to go out because the wind and rain have cleared, but the storm discharges one last parting bolt to an area of ground that remains charged. Be safe and get your family and friends to take shelter when a lightning storm approaches and stay out of the weather until the all-clear signals sound.

Outdoor activity may be resumed only after **three five-second horn blasts** have sounded, indicating that the storm has moved out of the area, and the strobe warning lights are off.

A July 4th Helpful Hint For Your Animals...

Keep your animals safe. Most animals are afraid of the loud fireworks and bright displays on July 4th.

PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn

drawing, in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a pre-drafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.

Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced special 2019 homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330

July 15th, 2019 10:30 AM - 12:30 PM August 18th. 2019 10:30 AM - 12:30 PM

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card, AND
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2019 may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2019, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2019, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2018 not exceeding \$30,174. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2018 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2018 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).

Your Butterfly Garden: **ROUGE PLANT** Rivina humilis

This long-lived Florida native can attain a height of 3-5 feet, and a width of 1-3 feet. It grows very well in our South Florida climate, thriving in either shade or full-sun.

Rouge plant grows on its own in Southwest Ranches, mainly found in shady edges of woody locations. It can be propagated from cuttings or seed.

Rouge plant flowers year-round in South Florida with clusters of dainty pink-white flowers, and showy, red berries appearing on the plant at the same time. The flowers are beneficial to many pollinator species, and the berries provide food to several birds and mammals.


