## Council Member Steve Breitkreuz

The town administration is currently research-

ing alternatives for our Waste Collection Pickup. This includes not only the normal waste that you place out in the swale in your trash containers, but it also includes the every other week bulk pick up.

With this contract review, as with all contract negotiations, we are always looking for ways that as good or better service can be delivered for a less than or equal cost. One of the elements that we are looking at with this contract is possibly moving to a standard container for our solid waste (non-bulk and non-recycle waste). What this means is that, just as you have a standard container for your recyclables, you would now have a similar container, of a different color, for your solid waste.

We do not have the final numbers yet, but we are hoping that this will save you money in a couple of different ways. First, it is a more automated process. The collection equipment can empty the containers in an automated fashion and this should reduce overall cost. Second, while one container, with 2 pickups a week, should be sufficient for approximately 80% of our households, those that need an additional container would be able to obtain one. However, with that additional container, there would be an increase in cost, so that the overall cost distribution would be more equitable.

Also, we are looking at fairer ways to allocate the cost of the bulk waste that is collected every other week. We have a problem in our town where some individuals are putting out bulk for more than just their residential property. Either it is coming from another location outside town or it is coming from a non-residential (commercial) source within the local property. Neither of these is allowed, (If you have a commercial business in your home that generates significant waste, you are required to obtain, and pay for, a separate commercial container) but it is difficult to enforce except in a case by case basis. For the record, you are allowed up to 12 cubic yards of non commercial bulk waste every 2 weeks and you are able to place it out for pickup the weekend prior to your scheduled pickup. 12 cubic yards is about the size of a small SUV.

Should you exceed that amount, we are looking at ways to charge residents for overages and still pick up the bulk waste so it does not remain an eyesore for the coming weeks. This should lower the cost to those residents that are following the rules and put the cost burden on those that are exceeding the allowed amounts. Once again, fairer for everyone.

With both of these potential plans, there are still details to be worked out. However, I thought you should know what may be coming. One final note. If you are considering buying a new trash container, you may want to hold off for a few more months until this decision is settled. As I mentioned above, you may be getting a new one from the town!

Hello everyone,

I have a short story to share with you. A few weeks ago, early in the morning, I was awakened by the ringing of my phone, and to my surprise it went to voice mail. A pleasant voice on the other end stated, "Serious charges have been pressed against you and before the local police come to arrest you, you should call the following #...... So I personal did. They wanted information of which I refused to give, and I asked to speak to a supervisor. I was denied. party hung up, and I called back. Pretty much the same again. Thev did however, identify themselves as the IRS. WRONG! This was a big scam. The IRS NEVER calls you. I filed a report with our local police and then followed up by contacting the IRS. If the IRS tells you they can't do anything, tell them a letter to Representative State Governor Scott will follow this phone call. Do not be afraid of a call like this but please remember, **GIVE** NOT

DO ANY INFORMATION TO ANYONE WHO ASKS FOR IT OVER THE **PHONE.** If they were the IRS, would have all your information already. This type of abusive scam must stop but it has to start with you educating yourself about this kind of activity.

Don't become a Victim of a Scam! An IRS web article titled "IRS Urges Public to Stay Alert for Scam Phone Calls" states the IRS WILL NOT:

- Call you to demand immediate payment. The IRS will not call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying.

The Southwest Ranches Firefighters have been working hard on the Trapped Lost Firefighter/RIT


Training. This is in addition to our Medical and other Firefighting training.

# 2017 U.S.C.G. Auxiliary VESSEL EXAM

The residents of Southwest Ranches can now obtain a FREE "Vessel Exam" at you home.

A Vessel Exam insures that you have all the required Safety Equipment on your boat and that you meet all the other rules and regulations.

Not having the proper equipment or violating a regulation can get you a ticket that may cost you \$100.00 or more per violation.

With this FREE exam, YOU CAN NOT RECEIVE A TICKET. With the exam, you will be given a copy of the report indicating any deficiency that needs to be corrected. After you make the correction you can contact me to a re-inspection. When everything is good you will be given the 2017 Vessel Exam safety sticker.

All fresh water boats, salt water boats, jet skis and air boats need to meet the requirements.

The new stickers are here so don't wait to schedule your Vessel Safety Exam.

# CODE ENFORCEMENT AND YOU: BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR, NOISE AND PARTIES THAT AFFECT OTHERS"

Our Town of Southwest Ranches is a rural community and strives constantly to maintain the character that our founders and residents envisioned. Many times

without realizing we



tend to deviate or stray away from this vision, either because we forget or because we are new to our area. This article serves

communicate with our established and new residents that one needs to be conscious of the impact that can be created to adjacent neighbors by our actions and "be a good neighbor." Issues as excessive noise created by volume and amounts of guests attending a party are becoming more prevalent and hence this article.

#### Noise Limits (volume, time of day), attendees, parking impact

Recently the Department has seen an increase in the amounts of complaints related to excessive noise beyond a reasonable time.

Many cases relate to parties that start late and continue to even later evening hours or early morning hours, creating noise beyond the normal levels. As a reminder, we follow the regulations that are part of Town of Southwest Ranches Unified Land Development Code, Section 035-080 when it

relates to noise.

Our code does not allow for noise amplified or nonamplified to be audible from an adjacent dwelling or quest house (with closed windows and doors) from the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. Monday to Friday and 11:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. Saturdays and Sundays. Also as related to New Years' Eve hours where no amplified or non-amplified noise cannot be heard in the same manner are from 1:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. on New Years' Day.

In addition, a residential special event assembly application is required if the assembly will be attended by more than 30 people. This permit needs to be submitted within 15 business days from the date of the event.

In addition, these parties have presented traffic and parking issues to adjacent neighbors due to the amount of attendees and the parking of vehicles obstructing traffic and side streets. We need to

be conscious that a large amount of vehicles parked along our narrow streets and in front of properties, create an impact on our neighbors. The Police Department has been called to these events because cars are blocking traffic lanes, and driveway entrances. Please be mindful of your neighbors and the impact that this issue creates.

As reminder. the Code Enforcement Department only works based on complaints from residents as it is non pro-active in nature. We believe that everyone has the right to enjoy their property without any outside intrusion. Non-withstanding this fact when a complaint comes into Department we have to investigate and provide the corresponding notification to the property owner.

We all live in a beautiful and special Town. The Town of Southwest Ranches would like to ask for our new, established, and rental residents to be mindful of these issues and help us continue to maintain the character that we all envisioned. Let's work together to make sure that these simple

guidelines are followed, so that we can continue to enjoy the rural lifestyle that we all love so much and moved here for. Enjoy your property but "be a good neighbor". If you have any questions about the above, you can contact the Code Enforcement Department at (954) 434-0008.



# PUBLIC WORKS CORNER

The Town is nearing completion of a major stormwater conveyance project located at the intersection of SW 185th Way and SW 55th Street. The project includes the installation of drainage pipe and structures that will alleviate significant flooding conditions at the respective intersection. Once completed,

street stormwater runoff will have a positive discharge connection to the South Broward Drainage District canal just east of SW 185th Way.

The Town is also in the design phase for two drainage improvements: SW 54th Place from Frontier Trails to the intersection of SW 195th Terrace and the other along Dykes Road (SW 160th Avenue) near Griffin Road, which has been funded in part by both the South Broward Drainage District and the South Florida Water Management District.

The Town is currently bidding

the 2017 TSDOR project, which will resurface roadways and improve drainage.


After upcoming capital improvement projects in the Town include four park projects: Calusa Park picnic pavilion and playground, Found-

er's Trailside Park pavilion, Country Estates Park ballfields, and the Rolling Oaks Park Barn storage room enclosure. These improvements have been funded mostly by grants and donations.

The Town was recently awarded an additional \$300,000 from the Florida Department of Transportation for guardrails along

Stirling Road. This safety improvement is scheduled to be complete in 2017.
