Dear Neighbors,

As I meet residents around Town one of the more common concern is the spill over of lights caused by the fixtures homeowners or businesses use on their properties. Many property owners are unaware the Town has a very firm restriction against this type of light pollution. Article 95 of the Town Code of Ordinances, commonly referred to as the "Dark Sky Ordinance," requires all lights on a property must only shine on the property it is attached to and may not spill over onto an adjacent property. With the proliferation of LED lights many property owners are installing lights and fixtures that are violating this standard. If you are considering replacing or installing light fixtures outside your home or business, please consult with our Zoning Department to gain a greater understanding of what is and what is not allowed. Additionally, if you believe a property owner is violating this standard please contact our Code Enforcement Department for Town assistance.

Another concern raised by residents around Town is excessive speeding. By resident request, we have increased traffic enforcement for speeding in some of our western portions of Town. Unfortunately, the majority of those

Today our Town has two type of

plant nurseries: plant nurseries where farm products are grown, raised or cultivated that may be sold on the same plot for wholesale and plant nurseries that sell plants and plant products or landscape materials directly to the public. We'll call the first a wholesale plant nursery, the second we will call a retail plant nursery. A wholesale plant nursery is regulated by Florida statute 823.14, the Florida Right to Farm Act. A retail plant nursery is regulated by the

Town and presently not an acceptable use (read illegal) in any of our land use or zoning categories.

Since retail plant nurseries are not an acceptable use under the law, a new resident can move in, decide they don't like a retail plant nursery operating on their street, that may have perhaps been operating for 20-30 years. If the resident is diligent enough, they can effectively put the retail nursery out of business under current law.

Last spring, a new ordinance began to be drafted to address the issue. The ordinance contains a special exception process that will provide for a retail plant nursery to become an acceptable use of land to sell plants and certain landscape materials such as stepping stones, river rock, cap rock, mulch, top soil and other supplies.

This change will allow property owners a process to make their retail plant nurseries legal under the town's ordinances and allow them to stop worrying about someone calling code and possibly closing their business. This ordinance also allows the sale of "cottage foods," which are foods produced from farm products grown on the property like honey, mango jam, and other such food products. Finally, the ordinance will regulate non-agricultural activities such as commercial landscape maintenance operations.

For the latest draft of the Nursery Ordinance, contact town hall at 954-434-0008. This ordinance will have its first public hearing at the Council meeting on 3/28. If you have an interest in this change to our code, please attend the meeting to contribute to make this a better ordinance.





Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced special 2018 homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330

Monday, February 25th - 10:30 am - 12:30 pm Monday. March 18th - 10:30 am - 12:30 pm

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card. AND
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- · Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of **January 1, 2018** may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2018, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2018, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2017 not exceeding \$29,454. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2017 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2017 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).

**DEADLINE for any 2018 EXEMPTIONS is September 18th, 2018*

A Small History of the Challenge Coin

Utilized to signify membership to an organization, these small coins come in a variety of shapes and usually bear designs identifying the organization they represent.

The coins date back to Roman times, and are still utilized to show appreciation, exemplary performance, identification. In some cases, they may serve as fundraisers (as those of the Southwest Ranches Education Advisory Board).

In WWI, a challenge coin was credited with saving the life of a French soldier. After being shot down by the Germans, he was removed of everything but his leather pouch containing his coin. He managed to escape and return to France. He was initially thought to be a spy and sentenced to execution, but recognition of his coin's insignia saved his life!

Following WWII, the coins came to bear the following challenge: if slammed on the bar counter, the person challenged must present their coin, otherwise the bar tab was theirs to pay; presentation of a coin left the challenger paying the bill.

Coins have come to commemorate survival, membership in a special military group, allegiance, may be passed-on via secret handshake ...the list continues.



YOU AND YOUR FIRE EXTINGUISHER...

Southwest Ranches Firefighters want residents to be knowledgeable about fire extinguishers. Check the date of your extinguisher to assure it is not expired and out of date. Most fire extinguishers are required to be annually inspected by a licensed contractor. The majority of fire extinguishers are type ABC which handles three classes of fire.

See the source protection...

- a. ordinary combustibles (paper, wood and plastics)
- b. flammables (flammable and liquid combustibles) and
- c. electrical combustibles (electrical equipment).

Note: This type of extinguisher is most common found in commercial occupancies and residential homes.

The extinguishers are very easy to operate for small fires: P.A.S.S. is the acronym used to help you remember what to do when using the extinguisher.

- P Pull the metal pin
- A Aim the nozzle
- S Squeeze until discharge is completed
- S Sweep the area on fire

PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn drawing, in compliance with the Florida

Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a pre-drafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.

A phone call to us will help prevent a possible warning from Code Enforcement and double fees when it comes to acquiring the required permit.


