

# Mayor Doug Mckay

Dear Residents,

Because of the importance of this issue I am re-running my article from the September newsletter:

On November 6, 2018 two important items will be on the general election ballot that will materially affect the future of our Town. These two ballot questions will change current voting requirements for the sale or long-term lease of town owned property, and also for all land use changes to require a unanimous vote of the Town Council.

Currently, a simple majority vote of the Town Council is all that is required to enter into a sale or long-term lease of Town owned property. The first ballot question related to this will appear as follows: "Should the Charter of the Town of Southwest Ranches be amended to require the unanimous vote of the entire Town Council, and a referendum of the electorate, prior to entering into any long term lease agreement or sale of property owned by the Town, with limited exception?" This will require a unanimous vote of the Town Council and then an election. or special election, to allow the voters to decide.

On quasi-judicial matters and land use changes a supermajority, or a "yes" vote of at least 4 members of the Town Council is all that is currently required to make this change. The second ballot question related to this matter will change it and appears as follows: "Should the Charter of the Town of Southwest Ranches be amended to require the unanimous vote of

all five Council Members for land use and quasi-judicial items?" This will change the current requirement from 4 votes to all 5 Council Members to approve.

If the will of the residents is to have a property rezoned, or for the Town to sell or lease a piece of town-owned property, a single Council Member could hamper the will of the people. Additionally, the first ballot question requires a referendum (election) be held, which could cost money.

# Council Member Gary Jablonski

In case you were unable to read

the September newsletter article. I am re-submitting most of the article on this very important ballot decision the Council has put on in the **NOVEMBER ELECTION TO LET YOU THE VOTERS DECIDE.** 

On this November's ballot our Town has two charter amendments.

The first issue deals with Townowned land. Currently, Townowned property could be sold or leased with as little as one affirmative vote by a simple majority of the Town Council. The proposed Charter Amendment would require the unanimous vote of the entire Town Council and approval by the electorate before any Town-owned land could be sold or leased. So, before Town owned property could be sold or leased, it will require the unanimous vote of the entire Town Council, and then approval by the electorate. The vote by the electorate confirms residents agree with the Council's decision.

The second ballot question makes it more difficult to pass most quasi-judicial and land use items. Currently, a quasi-judicial or land use decision requires the affirmative vote of 4 of 5 Council Members. The proposed charter amendment would require all such decisions to be unanimous (all 5 Council Members must vote in favor). Although most changes that have been voted

on have actually been unanimous, this ballot measure will require it to be unanimous with no exceptions.

Charter amendments can only be changed by the voters at elections. An example of the Ballot questions is included in this issue.

It is my privilege and honor to serve you, and helping to preserve our rural lifestyle.

# Council Member Dee Schroeder

Voters, taxpayers and residents, come No-

vember you will be voting for one (I) of the two (2) candidates who are running for a Town Council seat, as well as on two (2) Amendments which the Town has put on the ballot. As one of your Council Members, I feel it is extremely important to explain the Amendments to the Town Charter, and how they may affect you as property owners.

A Yes Vote - Amendment #I affects any property owned by the Town, which is to be leased or sold. If this Amendment passes, it will require a unanimous vote by the entire Council on any long term lease or sale of Town property for it to pass. If just one Council member votes no, then the lease or sale fails. If the Council unanimously votes yes, then the issue must go to the voters and will require a majority of voters to pass. If there is

no election coming up, you will have two (2) choices. One is to wait for the next election and two is to hold a special election, which would cost the Town thousands of dollars to set up a special election for that item.

A No Vote – The Charter stays the same which only requires a 3-2 vote of the Council to approve the long term lease or sale of Town-owned land.

A Yes Vote - Amendment #2 will affect every property in Town. If this Amendment passes, it will require a unanimous vote by the entire Council (5 votes) for land use issues, which includes zoning and quasi-judicial items. A single member of the Council may prevent a property from being re-zoned.

# A No Vote - The Charter stays the same, which only requires 4 votes of the Council to approve.

I am truly honored to be representing all residents in our Town as your Council Member, and I take great pride in helping you with your concerns. Please don't hesitate to call me. I am here for you!

In the pursuit of "curb appeal" for our properties, it is entirely possible to achieve a beautiful face without relying on commercially-popular

but non-native plants or chemicals and herbicides.

Laura Sampson of Clermont, Florida learned this lesson when wildlife in her yard didn't simply fail to thrive, it failed to live. She and her husband Chris decided that finding ways to make their home as attractive to wildlife as it was to people would be their goal.

Today, Laura's yard is a NWF Certified Habitat, and Laura is a Certified Habitat Steward who teaches neighbors how to welcome wildlife into their yards. Also a certified green home stager, Laura helps people to "green market" their homes and businesses to make eco-friendly improvements.

Greening is a boost for the environment and pocketbook:

- · According to the EPA, the average American household uses about 30% of its water outdoors. Using native plants best-suited to a property can reduce outdoor water use by 20-50%.
- Strategic plantings that provide shade in the summer and insulate against winter winds can reduce cooling and heating costs by as much as 40%.

Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced special 2018 homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330

Monday, October 15th, 2018 11:30 AM - 1:00 PM Thursday, November 1st, 2018 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM Thursday, December 6th, 2018 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM

#### **Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:**

- · A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card, AND
- · A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- · Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2018 may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2018, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2018, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2017 not exceeding \$29,454. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2017 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2017 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).

#### \*\*DEADLINE for any 2018 EXEMPTIONS is September 18TH, 2018\*



- **AVOID A FINE OF \$500.00** Landscaper or Contractor generated waste on your property must be removed by that vendor for disposal.
- Bulk Piles over-the-limit of <u>12 Cubic Yards</u> per household will be picked up and the vendor will bill the resident the additional yardage at the rate of \$17.50 per cubic yard.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT 12 CUBIC YARDS IS EQUIVALENT TO THE SIZE OF A VOLKSWAGON BEETLE. (8 FEET WIDE BY 14 FEET LONG AND 4 FEET TALL).

# PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn drawing,

in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a predrafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.

## STAY IN TOUCH WITH ENGINEERING

Fill for horse stalls does not require a fill permit. In addition, a permit may not be required if a small amount of sand is required to replenish a horse arena. However the Town recommends that a property owner or leasee contact our office to assure that the type of work being performed falls under this criteria prior to performing the work. A phone call to us will help prevent a possible warning from Code Enforcement and double fees when it comes to acquiring the required permit.

## FENCE GUIDELINES

## Waste Pro WILL pick up...

- 1. Fence boards and posts that are 4 feet long
- 2. Chain link fence generated by a resident under 12 cubic yards will be picked up. If a company replaces the fence it would be contractor generated and will not be picked up.

### Waste Pro WILL NOT pick up...

- **1.** Fence boards that have Creosote on them. They can be brought to the HHW event (see the newsletter for dates).
- 2. Fence boards with concrete attached can be brought to the Broward County Land Fill:

7101 SW 205 Ave., Fort Lauderdale, 33332 (The landfill entrance is on Sheridan Street 1/2 mile east of U.S. 27 on the north side).


