

As Spring approaches I wish to tell you about a wonderful new safety program that will benefit all Broward County residents. The Yellow Dot program was recently initiated by Broward County Mayor Martin Kiar. The Yellow Dot program is designed to assist Broward County residents and first responders in the event of an automobile crash or other medical emergency involving the participant's vehicle. The program can help save lives by improving communication at a time when accident victims may be unable to communicate for themselves. Motorists fill out an informational card that they leave in the glove compartment. They also place a yellow dot on their back windshield which advises first responders that they are participating in the program. The best part - the program is free. Visit our website for more information, or come by Town Hall to pick up your decal and information card.

At the direction of the Town Council. theComprehensive Planning Board is

once again taking up the topic of the appropriate land use for the most western section of our town. Specifically they are looking at the land use for the properties on the east side of US 27. The land use is the most general description of what a certain section of property can be used for. Once that is in place, even a town ordinance can not be in conflict with the Land Use.

Current about half of that section along US27 is privately owned and half of it is owned by the State of Florida, specifically the South Florida Water Management District. However, the State property has been surplused by the state which means that it is on the list to be sold. So, that could increase the pressure to develop that land in one fashion or another.

The reason why the Council has asked the Comp Board to review the land use is because, first and foremost, we want to get out in front of any specific plans that might be submitted to the Town. It is better to make the decision that regarding how this property should developed rather than possibly getting enamored with one specific exciting plan that, in the long run, is not in keeping with our rural lifestyle.

The second reason why this task is underway is because of all the areas

in Town, those properties that are directly on US 27 are among the properties that would be least suitable for single family homes. Therefore, if that is not the proper development, then what is the proper development? So that is what the Comp Plan Board is reviewing. We have had public participation and we sincerely appreciate that. The Board, made up Ken Cimetta, Bob Hartmann, Newell Hollingsworth, George Morris, and Steve Winner, is taking on this task and I sincerely appreciate all of the time and effort that this will take. I expect this to come before the Council in March and would welcome your input there as well.


Another year has passed since we created our Town and we celebrated

We had a big crowd with food, games and entertainment for all ages. We also opened one of our new parks which was one of the parks we received from Broward County in their programs supported with their big bond issued to create new parks within Broward County with money supplied by the Town or City in which they were built. Thanks to our grant writer Emily who was able to obtain grants to do some of the work but there is still lot of work to be done to complete the whole park. This park has something for everyone, a trail around the complete park which can be used for most activities such as horseback riding, hiking but the trail is not opened to motorized vehicles, also it has a very nice area for the young and old to come and ride the swings, slide board and just sit on the benches and enjoy the wildlife. We were able to build bathrooms and a pavilion to have picnics on. There is plans for a future horse wash rack which will be next to the existing horse corral, which was built by one our boy scouts, who was working on his merit badges. Also there is an area that is set aside for wetlands this area cannot be altered any way, this area can be used as a walk area which is lined with many varieties of trees which were planted when this area was used as a nursery.


On February 2, 2016 Pastor Forest Willis from the New Hope Church provided

Although she has had their home certified with the National Wildlife Federation as a habitat since July of 2006, Isolde is no stranger to Florida or Southwest Ranches. She has lived in the state since 1959, and they have owned their home since 1995. Isolde and Gerry couldn't be happier.

Isolde's passion for wildlife and conservation was defined by her middle school science teacher, who mentored a budding interest in reptiles and wildlife in general. Reptiles fascinated Isolde as a young girl; so much that she kept many as pets. She still maintains a keen love and respect to this day.

At their Mustang Trail "refuge," the Cahills provide wildlife with the four critical elements needed for survival: water, food sources, cover

and places to raise young. The Cahill family wholeheartedly support Isolde's passion for wildlife. And Isolde is a woman on a mission: to provide as much habitat as possible for creatures whose native place has dwindled due to human encroachment in their space.

Giving wildlife a place in her yard seems noble, but Isolde's contribution goes beyond just her own yard—with contributions to many conservation organizations, including the National Wildlife Federation, the Florida Wildlife Federation, The Nature Conservancy, The Humane Society of the United States, and several others.




