

## Mayor Jeff Nelson

Good Day Neighbor,

The Town is working diligently to address safety concerns along both Griffin Road and Stirling Road as requested by residents. Unfortunately we lost two of our neighbors when their cars went into the canal along western Griffin Road. Because Griffin Road is maintained by Broward County, we urged them to install quardrails there before another tragedy occurred. In a collaborative effort, we worked with the County and the South Florida Water Management District to get this safety concern addressed as quickly as possible. The guardrails are being installed along Griffin Road from Bonaventure Boulevard west to SW 209th Avenue. We anticipate completion by June 7th. On Stirling Road, the Town has received funding from the state to complete the quardrail project along Stirling Road. Phase I of the project, which installed quardrails from SW 130th Avenue to SW 142nd Avenue, has already been completed. Phase II of this project will install quardrails between the 12600 Block of Stirling Road to SW 130th Avenue and from SW 142nd Avenue to SW 148th Avenue.

On another note, we had some great events in Town recently including the Southwest Ranches Parks Foundation Chili Cook Off, and the Rolling Oaks Easter Egg Hunt. More events are slated, so keep an eye on future newsletters.

A perennial event that I am so proud

of is the upcoming Schools and Education Advisory Board College Scholarship Fundraiser and Food Truck Event on Saturday May 14th. The proceeds of the event will benefit Southwest Ranches high school seniors and college students by providing a financial scholarship to help offset college costs. Please come out and enjoy yourselves at this great event. There will be music, auctions for great prizes, and even a petting zoo for the kids. I hope to see you there.

When you arrive in Southwest Ranches, by most indicators, you


know it! Even traveling by air, during the day you see that large green patch. At night you see that area where nary a light can be seen. When you drive through town, the open spaces are dramatically different than the surrounding communities. However, as we work to build and maintain our rural lifestyle, something struck me as very un-rural and I would like to get your input on changing that.

We literally have signs all around town displaying this un-rural characteristic. On my street, that sign says 195th Terrace. When I see a sign such as 195th, I picture the suburbs of a city, not a rural community. A good portion of our town has already resolved this issue by having named their roads with equestrian or rural names. I am proposing that the rest of the town have the opportunity to do the same.

Not that this would be dictated to any road, it would certainly be up to the residents of that road. And certainly picking a name would not be easy and we are still working on the mechanics and quidelines associated with that process. However, where there is a will there is a way. I believe that this is a big step toward building the sense of community that is so important to Southwest Ranches.

I would like to get your input as to

moving forward with this process. I am working with the administration to put together a plan for how to accomplish this and you will be hearing more in the coming months. ## Council Member Freddy Fisikelli

I believe one of the most important subjects is

the proposed one cent sales tax which will be on the November ballot. In order for this to be accepted and passed they must present a plan for spending this money. One of the choices is the Transportation Surtax. This is the one recommended by the Broward MPO Board and the Broward County Commission with a revenue split of 70% to the County and 30% to the municipalities. This will benefit the lower income class who are most user of public transportation on the other hand there are those that believe it should be used for other things.

F.S. 212.055 provides two types discretionary Sales surtaxes: transportation or infrastructure. Essentially the transportation surtax would provide 100% of revenue to the county, and the county would use these proceeds for traffic related projects such as bus systems, fixed guideway rapid transit systems, on-demand transportation services and roads and bridges. The infrastructure tax would provide 40% of the revenue to the county and 60% would be distributed to the municipalities based on the population.

PS don't forget Mother's Day is coming up.



## CODE ENFORSEMENT AND YOU: BULK DURING HURRICANE SEASON

Once again the Hurricane Season is rapidly approaching. This article serves as a refresher to current residents and informational to our new residents in regards to the do's and don'ts that our residents need to know:

### "DO's"

- 1). The removal of excessive branches and trees limbs which can damage your
- residence is one of the many precautions that one needs to be aware of and take action prior to the Hurricane Season. After all we are a "Tree City USA" designated municipality which makes us a very unique Town. We are very proud of our trees, but at the same time they can be detrimental to your property and possibly to adjacent properties as well.



- 2). Placement of cuttings under the guidelines of bulk is also encouraged. One must remember that the maximum amount allowed per bulk pickup date is 12 cubic yards. If you are including household items as part of the pickup, they must be counted towards the maximum allowed. In addition, the branches cannot be larger than 4'-0" in length or our contractor will not be able to provide a pickup.
- 3). Adhere to the correct collection date and week. As a reminder, bulk can be placed out for pickup on the Saturday prior to collection week. Any items that are placed before this date may be subjected to warnings and possible fines.

### "DON'TS"

- 1). **DO NOT** wait until we are under a **Hurricane Watch or Warning** to begin any yard work that would require a bulk pickup. The date may not coincide with the collection date or week and the Town will not provide a special pickup to collect these items. The items will remain in place creating flying debris that will damage your property and others.
- 2). **DO NOT KILL THE TREES** many times in an effort to prevent damage to our properties we tend to cut the trees too much during cutting, creating a hatrack scenario. Hat racking occurs when we cut more that 20% of the original tree canopy. This type of **action is illegal** and you will be cited accordingly. There is even the possibility that you will be required to install a replacement tree or more on the property.

Code Enforcement works with all residents to make sure that all their needs are met. In addition, let's have a safe, not sorry Hurricane Season, we all depend on your help with this issue, to keep our trees and to protect our neighbor's properties.




