Dear Residents,

With Memorial Day fast approaching, our military heroes who have lost their lives in service to our country come to mind. I am proud of the men and women who have served or are actively serving in our military who work tirelessly to protect our freedom. I'm also proud of my colleagues on the Town Council who recently joined me in issuing a Proclamation making the Town of Southwest Ranches a Purple Heart Community. The Town also has an established history of working with the Military Heroes Support Foundation and the Marine Corps League to assist service members and their families. To illustrate this support, a presentation will be made during the May 25th Town Council Meeting by the West Broward Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC). This dynamic group of young men and women organized a drive to fill several boxes of donated snacks and sundry items that were then donated to the Military Heroes Support Foundation for distribution to service members and their families. Please take time to review the work done by these charitable organizations and donate if you can.

On another note, one of the issues that I hear about most often is the enforcement of the Town's Code. Code enforcement is

handled by our contracted provider, Code Services, Inc. The Town Council establishes policy direction on which issues should be proactively pursued, and those that should be pursued only reactive to complaints. Currently, the Town proactively pursues violations of the Town Code concerning bulk waste, fill being brought onto a property without a permit, and overgrown vegetation. All other violations of the Town Code are investigated after the receipt of a complaint. The Town's philosophy behind this policy decision has been to let residents enjoy their properties with minimal government interference. As your Mayor, I would love to know your thoughts about this. One of the things that I review on a weekly basis is

the weekly crime report that is provided to our Town by Davie Police. Overall, I will say that by almost any standard, the crime in our town is very low. We look after one another's properties and report items that are out of the ordinary. However, in reviewing this report, at times I will see something that appears to be a growing problem. I would like to touch on a couple of those this month.

First, I have to say that while we live in a very safe community, at times that leads us to let our guard down. I am seeing a significant number of calls where items are taken out of vehicles and the vehicles are not locked. This is a crime of opportunity, someone looking for free stuff and finding valuable items in plain site with no protection. There have also been reports where garage doors are left open all night which opens up the home to even more significant danger. Please take this as a reminder to lock up your vehicles and your home. We live in a safe place but let's help keep honest people honest.

The other item that I wanted to touch on is our animals, dogs in particular. We have a lot of won-

In March I shared a story with you regarding a scam phone calls. Since then I have spoken to many residents who shared their stories of identity theft, which compelled me to do more research. Here are some scary statistics for Florida:

- Florida ranked #3 in the country for Identity Theft in 2015, just behind Connecticut (#2) and Missouri (#1)
- In 2016, 16 billion dollars was stolen from 15.4 million US Consumers compared to 15.3 billion and 13.1 million victims a year earlier.
- Florida ranked # 2 in cyber crime victims alone, right behind California (#1)

So how do we protect ourselves? By educating ourselves. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) has wonderful information on how citizens can learn about all types of scams including:

- Identity Theft
- Charity Fraud
- Health Care Scams

**FOR ALL APPLICANTS:**

- Florida Drivers License OR Florida I.D. Card; AND
- Proof of Broward Voter Registration OR a Declaration of Domicile; AND
- Social Security Number for all owners

**FOR RESIDENT ALIENS:**

- Permanent Resident "Green Card," or proof of asylum, or INS I-485 letter showing that application to convert to permanent resident status is complete.

*The Senior Exemption requires at least one owner be 65 as of January 1, 2016 and the total household adjusted gross income not exceed \$28,448. (call for info on required documents)*

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a pre-drafted architectural plan for a three (3) stall barn and tack room from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.



## CODE ENFORCEMENT AND YOU: BULK DURING HURRICANE SEASON

Once again the Hurricane Season is rapidly approaching. This article serves as a refresher to current residents and informational to our new residents in regards to the do's and don'ts that our residents need to know:

### "DO'S"

1). *The removal of excessive branches and trees limbs, which can damage your residence, is one of the many precautions that one needs to be aware of and take action prior to the Hurricane Season. After all we are a "Tree City USA" designated municipality, which makes us a very unique Town. We are very proud of our trees, but at the same time they can be detrimental to your property and possibly to adjacent properties as well.*



2). *Placement of cuttings under the guidelines of bulk is also encouraged. One must remember that the maximum amount allowed per bulk pickup date is 12 cubic yards. If you are including household items as part of the pickup, they must be counted towards the maximum allowed. In addition, the branches cannot be larger than 4'-0" in length or our contractor will not be able to provide a pickup.*

3). *Adhere to the correct collection date and week. As a reminder, bulk can be placed out for pickup on the Saturday prior to collection week. Any items that are placed before this date may be subjected to warnings and possible fines.*

### "DON'TS"

1). ***DO NOT** wait until we are under a **Hurricane Watch or Warning** to begin any yard work that would require a bulk pickup. The date may not coincide with the collection date or week and the Town will not provide a special pickup to collect these items. The items will remain in place creating flying debris that will damage your property and others.*

2). ***DO NOT KILL THE TREES** – many times in an effort to prevent damage to our properties we tend to cut the trees too much during cutting, creating a hatrack scenario. Hat racking occurs when we cut more that 20% of the original tree canopy. This type of **action is illegal** and you will be cited accordingly. There is even the possibility that you will be required to install a replacement tree or more on the property.*

*Code Enforcement works with all residents to make sure that all their needs are met. In addition, let's have a safe, not sorry Hurricane Season. We all depend on your help to keep our trees and to protect our neighbor's properties.*

## What is Precycling?

Precycling is the step we take to reduce the amount of trash we make. An example is utilizing reusable plates and silverware instead of disposable paper plates and plastic flatware.

The idea is simple. By making less waste, and recycling more, we preserve Earth's limited natural resources, reduce the amount of energy used, produce fewer carbon emissions, protect air, soil and water quality, save money and close the recycling loop.

The best way to reduce waste is not to create it at all. If we prevent waste, there's no waste to collect, process or dispose. Waste reduction combined with the three R's (Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle) is the recommended method for managing our solid waste. Another significant step you can take in waste reduction is being a thoughtful consumer. Before purchasing an item, consider if that item or its packaging can be reused or if there is a less wasteful alternative.


