- <u>AVOID A FINE OF \$500.00</u> Landscaper or Contractor generated waste on your property must be removed by that vendor for disposal.
- Bulk Piles over-the-limit of <u>12 Cubic Yards</u> will be picked up and the vendor will bill the resident the additional yardage at the rate of \$17.50 per the cubic yard.

Council Member Steve Breitkreuz

Recently I hear more and more about code viola-

tions that are occurring in our Town. Or if not a specific violation, a condition that has negatively impacted residents in our Town, but for which there currently is no restriction. This is always a frustrating occurrence, but when it happens more and more, it becomes even more important to take a close look at.

Specifically, there seems to be more and more commercial entities in residential neighborhoods as well as improvements that are occurring on residential properties without the proper permitting. In the past, both issues have been a difficult situation in which to find the proper middle ground. Our Town was built on having a minimal amount of regulation. Many individuals came to this area with the mindset of getting a large property and then generally being left alone. And certainly today, the lack of government interference is still a big part of who we are and who we should be.

However, on the other side of the coin are individuals or companies that come into our community, run a commercial business, and have little or no regard for the impact of their neighbors. Many times they pay minimal taxes if they are designated as agriculture. This can ruin neighbor relationships and create traffic and safety hazards in our community. Plus, the heavy com-

mercial traffic that it can generate can destroy the ability to enjoy our Town as a rural community. Certainly, we do have code regulations to control this to a degree, but it continues to be a growing problem.

We also have significant building being performed outside of the building code process. This can occur because we are, except for a few exceptions, a reactive code enforcement Town. Thus. until someone complains, code does not get involved. Unfortunately, this can also pit neighbor against neighbor.

There is not an easy solution to these situations. We want to protect the businesses that are doing things right. And we want to protect the residents that came here to enjoy a peaceful lifestyle. So, there is some work to be done to find that balance.

I am working with the administration as well as advisory boards where appropriate, to review alternate proposals in the hopes that we can make progress. Recently I've had several res-

idents ask me about bulk waste information that appeared in the February Sunshine Ranches Waggler newsletter president's column. While this information was copied from the Town's September Rancher newsletter, there are several issues with how it was presented in the Waggler.

While the text of the article was taken from a Code Enforcement article from September 2017, there are some concerns I must address. The president's article failed to present the information in the same way, leading to the questions I received. For example, the Town article included bold text and underlining to reinforce the information presented. The Waggler article did not. The Waggler article also failed to cite the Town article as the source of the information, and it was misleadingly presented as part of the president's column. In addition, any re-publication of information taken from the Rancher must not only cite the Town as the source but must also refer any questions directly to the Town. This will not only ensure residents questions are correctly answered, but that residents can also have confidence in the information they receive.

- Adopted Resolution 2018-045 approving an interlocal agreement with Broward County for the division and distribution of the local option gas tax.



- ☑ Permanent Resident "Green Card," or proof of asylum, or INS I-485 letter showing that application to convert to permanent resident status is complete.

In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2018, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2018, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property, AND have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2017 not exceeding \$29,454.

WILDLIFE HABITAT THE ROOTS OF CONSERVATION IN SOUTHWEST RANCHES

In Southwest Ranches, where greater than average numbers of insects, birds and animals make their homes among us, conservation of wildlife may seem unimportant. But the raccoons, opossums, peacocks, and other animals that share our neighborhoods aren't just pesky intruders. Conserving wildlife provides benefits to humans that can't be exaggerated: creating jobs, sustaining sources of food and water, and connecting us with nature in meaningful ways that last a lifetime.

Unfortunately, our impact on habitats also lasts a lifetime- in 2014, the World Wildlife Fund estimated that 58 percent of all wildlife species in the world have disappeared since 1970.

In the U.S., over a third of plant and animal species are in decline due to changes shaped by human life. According to the Land Trust Alliance, 4,000 acres of wildlife habitat is lost to development every day. Where one loss affects another, what long term results might our future hold as more species and habitats are lost?

It's not too late to transform these re-

sults, if we accept conservation as a fundamental value. The National Wildlife Federation's Garden for Wildlife program provides a model for conservation. Homes, businesses, and schools can provide crucial habitat almost effortlessly. With ongoing encouragement and assistance from Broward County and neighbors from Cooper City's Green Advisory Board, Southwest Ranches is poised to join a national network of certified Community Wildlife Habitats-but we depend on you for help.


Hurricane Irma created a big dent in South Florida's tree canopy, as it did in many of our own yards. By creating backyard habitats, Southwest Ranchers are maintaining a portion of the important Atlantic Flyway Corridor, a major migratory path of birds and pollinators.

There are many opportunities to participate. Sharing awareness of the value we derive from wildlife is a perfect place to start. Embracing wildlife conservation as a way of life figuratively keeps Southwest Ranches in line with our mission of Preserving

Our Rural Lifestyle while we literally work to remain in alignment with all the benefits we derive from the magnificent natural resource that makes up our western boundary - the Ever-

glades.

During Town's early visioning sessions. residents made it clear that you expected the Town's park



stewardship to protect natural resources. Thinking beyond just providing recreation, with each step of park development, we try to enhance habitat: by protecting open-spaces, creating wetlands, installing native plant species, we seek every opportunity possible to give wildlife what it needs.

CODE ENFORCEMENT AND YOU:

Town Wide Lighting Standards Adopted Article 95

We Keep Our Residents in the Dark

Outdoor Lighting Standards are a part of the Town's Code of Ordinances. The purpose of the Article was to create lighting standards that preserve the rural character of the Town and promoted the health, safety and welfare of the residents by establishing maximum intensities of lighting and controlling glare from lighting fixtures. The provisions of this Article apply to all permanent outdoor lighting from an artificial source.

Residents have complained about blinding lights or the annoying orange glare from a neighboring property. A light level of 1/10-foot candle measured horizontally at the property line is the law. The Department has equipment capable of measuring the intensity. To put it into perspective that is about moon light. This includes glare from lights, which shall be controlled by cutoff fixtures, shields and baffles.

The Town Council is mindful of the inherent nature of Rural Areas. Keeping native habitats for animals and our ability to see the stars at night are all encompassed in the formation of this new ordinance.

Specifics in the Ordinance

- Street lights are not allowed.
- · Stadium lights are not allowed
- Height restrictions to residential recreational lighting, glare, and spill off
- New construction required to submit a lighting plan

FP&L is aware of our regulations. Through their light lease agreement, they currently offer 2 types of lighting. The Box type light is not compliant with the Ordinance and Ranchers should NOT order it.

If you have a concern about glare or bright lights infringing on your Rural Lifestyle, or the glare that it may be creating towards your property, contact the Town's Code Enforcement division and we will act accordingly. Installation of arena lighting, tennis court or other recreational lighting is permitted as long as it meets the indicated regulation and a photometric plan is provided as part of the permitting process.



STAY IN TOUCH WITH ENGINEERING

Fill for horse stalls does not require a fill permit. In addition, a permit may not be required if a small amount of sand is required to replenish a horse arena. However the Town recommends that a property owner or leasee contact our office to assure that the type of work being performed falls under this criteria prior to performing the work. A phone call to us will help prevent a possible warning from Code Enforcement and double fees when it comes to acquiring the required permit.


