### Mayor Doug Mckay

Dear Residents.

On November 6, 2018 two important items will be on the general election ballot that will materially affect the future of our Town. These two ballot questions will change current voting requirements for the sale or long-term lease of Town-owned property and also for all land use changes to require a unanimous vote of the Town Council.

Currently, a simple majority vote of the Town Council is all that is required to enter into a sale or longterm lease of Town-owned property. The first ballot question related to this will appear as follows: "Should the Charter of the Town of Southwest Ranches be amended to require the unanimous vote of the entire Town Council, and a referendum of the electorate, prior to entering into any long term lease agreement or sale of property owned by the Town, with limited exception?" This will require a unanimous vote of the Town Council and then an election or special election, to allow the voters to decide.

On quasi-judicial matters and land use changes a supermajority, or a "yes" vote of at least 4 members of the Town Council, is all that is currently required to make this change. The second ballot question related to this matter will change it and appears as follows: "Should the Charter of the Town of Southwest Ranches be amended to require the unanimous vote of all five Council Members for land use and qua-

**si-judicial items?"** This will change the current requirement from 4 votes to all 5 Council Members to approve.

If the will of the residents is to have a property rezoned, or for the Town to sell or lease a piece of Town-owned property, a single Council Member could hamper the will of the people. Additionally, the first ballot question requires a referendum (election) be held, which could cost money.

In case you were unable to read

the August's newsletter article. I am re-submitting most of the article on this very important ballot decision the Council has put on in the November election to let you the voters decide.

On this November's ballot our Town has two charter amendments.

The first issue deals with Townowned land. Currently, Town-owned property could be sold or leased with as little as one affirmative vote by a simple majority of the Town Council. The proposed Charter Amendment would require the unanimous vote of the entire Town Council and approval by the electorate before any Townowned land could be sold or leased. So, before Town owned property could be sold or leased, it will require the unanimous vote of the entire Town Council, and then approval by the electorate. The vote by the electorate confirms that that residents agree with the Council's decision.

The second ballot question makes it more difficult to pass most quasi-judicial and land use items. Currently, a quasi-judicial or land use decision requires the affirmative vote of 4 of 5 Council Members. The proposed charter amendment would require all such decisions to be unanimous (all 5 Council Members must vote in favor). Although most changes that have been voted on have actually

As school starts again, it is time to get back into our

normal routines again and to consider the events that are coming up. As you may be aware, I have elected not to run for my seat on the Town Council again this November. I plan to run again at some future date, but for now, it was time to step down and to view the Town as a resident again. However, although I am stepping down, I did want to remind all of you that there are two Southwest Ranches Charter Amendments that you will be seeing on the ballot this November.

These amendments were adopted by the Council in June of 2017, and now must be voted on by the electorate before they can take effect. Please read the exact wording of the amendments when considering your vote. The first amendment dictates that before a parcel of land that is owned by our Town (we own over 150 acres) is sold or com-

been unanimous, this ballot measure will require it to be unanimous with no exceptions.

Charter amendments can only be changed by the voters at elections. An example of the Ballot questions is included in this issue.

mitted to a very long-term lease, it will require a unanimous vote of the Town Council. If it receives the unanimous vote of the Town Council, it will then go to the electorate for approval, before the sale or long-term lease takes place. Currently, our land can be sold or leased with only 3 affirmative votes, and it never goes before the electorate.

The second amendment calls for a unanimous vote by the Council for land use and zoning changes. Currently, the requirement to change land use or zoning requires 4 affirmative votes of the Town Council. This Charter Amendment will require the unanimous approval of the Town Council before a land use or zoning take effect.

So, I urge you to vote this November so that your feelings on these two matters can be heard.

It has been an absolute pleasure serving you and helping to preserve our rural lifestyle.



### Council Member Dee Schroeder

Voters, taxpayers and resi-

dents, come November you will be voting for one (1) of the two (2) candidates who are running for a Town Council seat, as well as on two (2) Amendments which the Town has put on the ballot. As one of your Council Members, I feel it is extremely important to explain the Amendments to the Town Charter, and how they may affect you as property owners.

A Yes Vote - Amendment #1 affects any property owned by the Town, which is to be leased or sold. If this Amendment passes, it will require a unanimous vote by the entire Council on any long term lease or sale of Town property for it to pass. If just one Council member votes no. then the lease or sale fails. If the Council unanimously votes yes, then the issue must go to the voters and will require a majority of voters to pass. If there is no election coming up, you will have two (2) choices. One is to wait for the next election and two is to hold a special election, which would cost the Town thousands of dollars to set up a special election for that item.

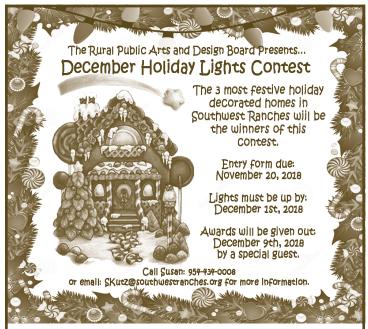
A No Vote — The Charter stays the same which only requires a 3-2 vote of the Council to approve the long term lease or sale of Town-owned land.

A Yes Vote - Amendment #2 will affect every property in Town. If this Amendment passes, it will require a unanimous vote by the entire Council (5 votes) for land use issues, which includes zoning and quasi-judicial items. A single member of the Council may prevent a property from being rezoned.

A No Vote - The Charter stays the same, which only requires 4 votes of the Council to approve.

I am truly honored to be representing all residents in our Town as your Council Member and I take great pride in helping you with your concerns. Please don't hesitate to call me; I am here for you!

# PROPER OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A SEPTIC TANK SYSTEM

The proper operation and maintenance of septic tank systems is critical to minimizing the impact on our health and water resources. Our sole source of drinking water, the Biscayne Aquifer, is just a few feet beneath the surface of the land. All that separates us from this underground water supply is a thin layer of sand. Consequently, our water supply is extremely vulnerable to contamination.

A major advantage of the septic tank is that it has no moving parts and needs very little routine maintenance. If properly operated and maintained the system should work for 10 to 20 years. But there are problems that may show up in the house plumbing, the septic tank, distribution pipes, and the soil absorption drainfield over time or if the system is improperly operated or maintained.

#### Signs to look for include:

- 1. Low spots in the area above or near the drainfield.
- **2.** Obnoxious odors ranging from a musty odor to a rotten egg odor to raw sewage odor.
- 3. The grass is much greener and lush above or near the drainfield.
- **4.** Soggy grass in the area above or near the drainfield during dry periods.
- 5. Gurgling sounds in the plumbing.
- **6.** Sluggish flow when flushing the toilet.
- 7. Backup of sewage in house plumbing.

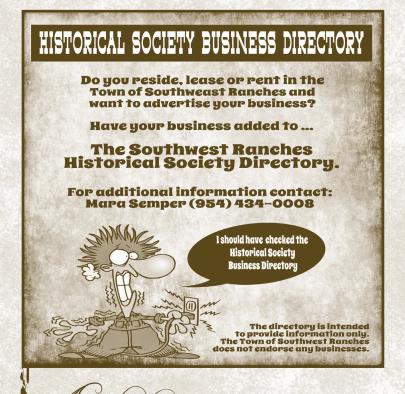
Over time all drainfields will fail because the capacity of the soil to absorb effluent has been exceeded. The soil becomes clogged and the effluent will rise to the surface of the ground. However, premature failure most often results from failure of the homeowner to periodically pump out the sludge from the tank.

If you need an inspection or repairs to an existing septic tank system, a state registered septic tank contractor or a state certified plumber should be called. The Broward County Public Health Unit maintains lists of State registered contractors and requires permits for all repairs and installations.

Septic system owners must ensure that their systems are maintained properly. Even a well-designed and properly operating septic tank system will eventually fail if it is not also maintained. Regular maintenance can prevent failures such as clogging of the soil absorption drainfield and sewage backup into the home.

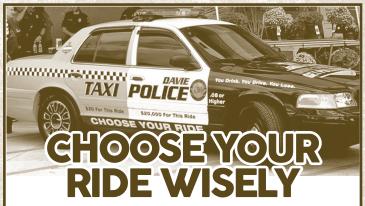

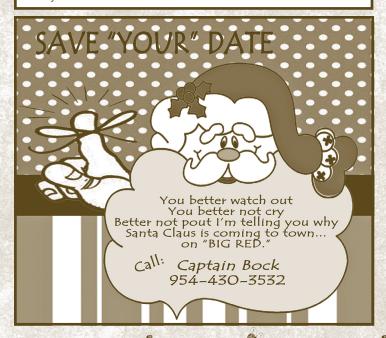

### PROTOTYPE BARN

In furtherance of the Town's goal of preserving its rural lifestyle, the Town Council has given residents a simpler mechanism to build a barn that is in compliance with Florida statutory requirements. As such, the Town contracted with an architect who agreed to create a prototype barn drawing,

in compliance with the Florida Building Code, which can be permitted for residents throughout the Town. The plans are for a three stall barn with a tack room.

A Town resident looking to build a barn can simply purchase a predrafted architectural plan from the Town, which they then can submit, at a reduced cost, and on an expedited basis, to get a permitted barn that will be in compliance with both state and local regulations.
