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

Dear Residents,

I am a strong proponent of protecting the SW Ranches lifestyle, which appeals to one of the most diverse resident bases in Broward County. Whether you have moved to SW Ranches to farm, or whether you have moved here to be left alone, SW Ranches has something to offer for everyone. As we head into our 20th year of existence, I believe that it is essential for us to continue to work to mesh the lifestyles of our residential and agricultural communities. The ability for a mega mansion to be built right next to farm truly makes us one of the most special places to live.

There has been much heated discussion amongst our community regarding the application of our fire assessment this year. As a result of changes to state law, we had to determine which commercial agricultural structures in the Town exceeded \$10,000 in value. These are the structures on properties that have an agricultural tax classification. As a result, the Broward County Property Appraiser assisted the Town in this process. Once a list was created, these structures were placed on the Town's fire assessment roll as commercial structures. most of these structures had not been looked at in the past, it was a surprise to many property owners

to see that their fire assessment fees had substantially increased.

After listening to the concerns of many residents, I fully agree that these structures should not have been placed in the commercial category. I do not personally believe that a barn should be lumped in with Publix and Lowes.

On August 20, 2019, the Town Council considered this item. I voted to place these structures into the agricultural category, while the majority of the Council voted to not charge for these structures, and to pay the approximately \$39,000 in lost fire assessments from the Town's general fund. Again, these are commercial agricultural structures, not residential barns.

While I fully support and promote our communities right to farm, and to make money from farming their land, I do not believe that it should be at the expense of all the other tax payers. As a result of the Council's decision, every resident is now subsidizing the Town's commercial farms. I believe that the commercial farms should pay their fair share for their fire protection, and that they should not get municipal services for free.

Next year the Town will be conducting a new fire study, which will hopefully set a specific fee for commercial agricultural structures. We will be forming a committee to specifically look at this issue. If you are interested in serving on this committee, please let me know. In addition, although I have heard from the commercial agricultural community, the residential community did not show up at the hearing. I am very in-

terested in knowing if you are willing to pay for the commercial agricultural communities fire fees, or if you believe, as I do, that they should be paying their fair share.

Again, meshing the agricultural and residential communities is one of the most difficult challenges that we face.

As always, please call me at 954-274-6508 if there is any issue I can help you with. If I don't know about a problem, I can't help you get it resolved.

There is a problem concerning

the fire assessment fee being applied to barns. Here are some of the facts related to this issue:

- This policy only applies to commercial buildings (But before you say that this does not apply to you, please read on).
- If you have a barn and do NOT have an agriculture exemption, you are not affected. If you have a barn and you DO have an agriculture exemption, this MAY apply to you.
- If you have a barn and you DO have an Agriculture exemption and the value of your barn is assessed at \$10,000 or more, then this does apply to you, below \$10,000, and it should not apply to you.
- This could impact other agricultural structures as well. Pole barns were defined as structures with at least 70% permanently open walls and were exempted from the Florida Fire Prevention Code
- This assessment does NOT increase revenue for the Town.
- This assessment SHIFTS a portion of the Fire Assessment revenue from our traditional commercial entities in Town such as Lowes (They get a fee reduction) and shifts it on to our Ag families. (They get a new fire fee that they never had before).

A quick thank you to former Council Member Steve Breitkreuz for providing these facts in a clear and concise manner.

When the 2020 fire assessment fees were discussed at the July 25th Council meeting, this shift in burden from traditional commercial was not mentioned in the presentation that preceded the vote to set next year's fire fee. This is a significant policy change. The resolution to set the fee passed 5-o. If this were communicated clearly. I would not have voted for this change in our fire assessment fee structure. This problem needs to be fixed now. The fire study used to formulate our fire fee policy was conducted in 2011. The policy worked for the last 8 years; the policy changed this past year. The policy needs to go back to the way it was. It is not dependent on a new study. There is a lot of work to make that happen, but from a policy standpoint, it is a simple change in policy. The town administration has been directed to provide options to resolve this is-

Many residents with equestrian operations attended the August 8 meeting. Their general feeling was that their small business should not shoulder the same cost-per-square-foot fees that multi-billion-dollar corporations operating in our town carry.

At the July 25th council meeting the 2020 tax rates, that will go out on the TRIM notices sent by the Broward County Property Appraisers Office, were set by the council. Very few residents attended that meeting. This issue will be discussed at the next council meeting and at the two public hearings for millage and budget adoption (9/12 tentative adoption, 9/26 final adoption). Please come out and voice any concerns about these tax proposals.



Southwest Ranches FIRE RESCUE

Dear Residents,

The Southwest Ranches Fire Rescue personnel have been continuing training and education at the Broward Fire Academy.

The training involves company operations dealing with commercial structure and residential house fires. We

had joint training with Davie Fire Rescue at Station-104 on motor vehicle accidents (MVA). Training consisted of fire ground operations, communication, cribbing and stabilization.

The Southwest Ranches Emergency Medical Technicians and Paramedics constantly update their training by using medical equipment, which keeps their medical skills sharp to better serve our residents and the folks passing through our Town.



On another note; I have picked up a few dogs running along Griffin Road and side streets and spend several hours trying to find the owners of the lost animals. Please make sure you have your animals safely contained at your home. Griffin Road is no place for our animals. We have found that some of the animals ARE chipped but the owner did not REGISTER them. Please make sure you register your pet's chip, our animals depend on us to take care of them.

Your Butterfly Garden: BLUE PORTERWEED

Stachytarpheta jamaicensis

This best way to distinguish South Florida's native variety of porterweed from its non-native relatives is by its low, trailing growth habit (non-natives grow more upright and reach 2 - 3 times taller). Attractive, dark green foliage and purple, pink or blue flowers are borne a few at a time on thick spikes above the leaves from summer through fall and through the year in our area, making porterweed an appealing addition to pollinator gardens.

Our native variety reaches about 1 foot in height at maturity and requires very little maintenance. This plant is adaptable, growing in full sun as well as partially shaded areas. Porterweed is drought-tolerant and does well in a wide variety of soils.


Porterweed is a host plant for the tropical buckeye butterfy. Butterflies that favor its nectar include clouded skippers, gulf fritillaries, red admirals, and julias. Hummingbirds are also attracted to this plant.



PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FILING DATES ANNOUNCED FOR TOWN OF SOUTHWEST RANCHES. **SOUTHWEST RANCHES**

Broward County Property Appraiser, Marty Kiar has announced special 2019 homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior and other property tax exemptions at Southwest Ranches Town Hall 13400 Griffin Road, Southwest Ranches, FL 33330

September 16th, 2019 10:30 AM – 12:30 PM October 21st, 2019 10:30 AM - 12:30 PM

Documents required to file a Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card. AND
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.
- If you are a new resident to Florida, please provide your Settlement Statement from your prior out of state property.

Qualified residents 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2019 may also apply for the Low-Income Senior Exemption. In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2019, an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, 2019, receive the Homestead Exemption on the property and have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2018 not exceeding \$30,174. Seniors must bring a copy of their 2018 Income Tax Return or a copy of their 2018 Social Security 1099 form (if no tax return was filed).


